Four South Governors Hit Ban on School Segregation

Richmond, Va., Jan. 25 (AP)—Four southern governors have agreed to ask their legislatures to prohibit "interposition" by the states against federal court decisions that outlawed segregation in public schools.

The governors of Georgia, Alabama, Mississippi and Louisiana have agreed to ask their legislatures to prohibit "interposition" by the states against federal court decisions that outlawed segregation in public schools.

The degree of protest that would be incorporated in the various interposition resolutions was left to the individual states, but there were indications three states would stop short of defying the high court.

Gov. George Ball Timmerman Jr. of South Carolina disclosed the stand of the Chief 50-cultures in a statement yesterday that followed a six-hour conference on school segregation problems.

No Outright Defiance

While none of the governors would commit himself immediately to a specific program, there were good indications Timmerman, Gov. Thomas B. Stanley of Virginia and Gov. J. P. Coleman of Mississippi would recommend resolutions that do not contain nullification or outright defiance.

Of those present, only Gov. Marvin Griffin of Georgia was outspokenly in favor of an all-out nullifying interposition. Columbia (Special)—The snow of pessimism and the ice of cynicism can hardly ever respect to numb the heart of a small pleasant lady now crippled by arthritis and the after effects of a shock.
Each new day Miss Florence Jones forgets her aches and pains and as patches of sunlight make their way through the trees and into her tiny workroom, the former school teacher prepares gifts for shut-ins, the hospitalized and the poor.
Perhaps you have read her letters published in The Herald asking for old Christmas cards and virtually every type of knick-knack. These handouts are her raw materials, but let's have the kindly, blue-eyed, delicate speaking lady come to the front and explain a few of the details.
'I ask for anything that might be thrown away, greeting cards, for instance. The average person opens up the stove and heaves them in. I make scrapbooks out of them for the hospitals or use the pictures for children's books. You can find some mighty pretty pictures on cards that you can't find anywhere else.
'People are pretty good at sending me things. I've had 66 packages delivered here in one day. The mail carrier, Ray Lyman, is a nice fellow. He hands all my bundles right into the house. I guess he could leave them out at the box if he wanted to, but he knows I don't get around any too well since my shock.'
Relay Station
Many of the 'hodge-podge' items just pass through a self-styled relay station Miss Jones has set up. When shut-ins are received she decides which of the many hospitals and homes could make the best use of them.
Miss Jones will be collecting and handling gifts until about March 15 when she calls a halt to her work in favor of getting plenty of fresh air. However, when the cold weather rolls around again she's back at her humanitarian endeavor.
She purchases the scrapbooks and pays for all her own mailing without batting an eyelash. Many institutions pick up her little packages and some collectors who ask her assistance often pay a visit to chat and see if Miss Jones has come up with anything startling.
No one has ever paid Miss Jones a penny, though often times she will come across a stamp or novelty that has been long sought by an individual. She refuses the money, saying, 'I just want to make people happy.'

East Windsor Plane Crash Fatal to Pair

East Windsor, Jan. 25 (AP)—A plane carrying a flying instructor and a student practicing landings and takeoffs crashed on a farm yesterday. Both were killed.
State Police said the plane, an Aerocraft Champion with dual controls, hadn't been in the air long before it nosed into the ground from a low altitude. The crash scene was about a half mile from the Skyark Airport from which the plane operated.
The dead were Robert Hanson, 56-year-old Windsor color photographer who was taking flying lessons; and instructor Albert Erickson, 49, owner and operator of the Skyark Airport, which is in the Warehouse Point section.
State Police said Hanson had a landings and takeoffs lesson scheduled for 4 p. m. and that the crash occurred between 4:15 and 4:30.
The plane cleared a large clump of trees before it plunged into the ground, State Police said. Hanson was seated in the front of the plane and Erickson behind him. They said they couldn't tell which one had the controls at the time of the crash.
From the position of the plane it appeared the aircraft had either just taken off or was circling the field.
H. B. Wetherell, assistant director of the State Department of Aeronautics, said a preliminary investigation showed the plane apparently stalled in the air.
The department said Hanson held a student's pilot license but had never soloed. It added that he recently purchased a 4-seater Aerocraft sedan.
Hanson, proprietor of the Craig-Hanson color laboratories of Windsor, worked on color photography of surgical techniques at Yale University.

When sentence was passed by Superior Court Judge Howard W. Alcorn, Gordon said sadly:
'I just get it right in the neck every time.
Gordon had pleaded innocent to the escape charge, contending he was unlawfully detained in prison. He said he was innocent of the money, saying, 'I just want to bring the original 20 to 30 years sentence.
