

## Dump Trucks

Paxpayers and property owners, at an hour-long town meeting last night, established a small claims branch of their Justice Court, approved funds for the purchase of two dump trucks and two snow plows, and tabled action on the controversial issue of delegating power to close schools during inclement weather.

Approval of \$13,794 for the trucks and plows was voted with little discussion. However, the issues of establishing the court and the power to close achools sparked considerable, and at times heated discussion.

No-School Issue Affed On the school issue: Placed on the call of the meeting by petition of 400 residents, the issue called for appointment of a committee to be responsible for the closing of schools whenever emergencies or adverse weather conditions exist.

The petition had been circulated by a group of citizens following failure of Superintendent of Schools Worcester Warren to close schools during the snow-storm last week. At last night's meeting, Russell Potter, chairman of the Board of Education, explained that after consideration by the board a policy was adopted whereby the senior school bus drivers, the Board of Selectmen and the Sate-

ty Patrol would act in an advisory capacity as to whether achools should be in session or closed for the day in the event of a storm.

However, the superintendent of schools would still have the final word on the closing of schools under this policy. er this policy.

John T. Cousin, who originated
he petition, claimed the Board of
ducation's policy had several "weak spots."
Said Cousin of Warren:
"I question whether the man is capable of deciding whether or not to close school. I think someone else should be able to make the decision." cision."

The small claims court, he explained, handles debts up to \$250, at a nominal cost to the creditor. It is not a separate court, but a branch of the Justice Court, and the only expense to the town is in additional compensation for the trial justice.


