

Coventry \$235 Per Pupil Cost Listed; Travel Excluded in Report

Coventry, Jan. 29 (Special)—Approximately \$235 per pupil spent by the town for education during the 1954-55 school year, based on an average daily attendance of 1,201.

According to the Connecticut Public Expenditures Council these figures have nearly tripled since the 1942-43 school year when the per pupil cost was \$77.85.

The figures in the report include elementary and high school expense exclusive of transportation costs.

Of the total amount expended during the 1954-55 school year of \$232,700.38 there was \$60,948.56 received from state aid with the balance of \$221,581.82 coming from local funds. Of the per pupil expenditure of \$235.45 there was \$104.75 received from state aid and \$130.70 from local funds. The figures show the per pupil expenditure to be \$37.02 over that of the 1952-53 school year.
