"One of the replies suggested that it was essentially the job of the Principal, utilizing the assistance of the Superintendent and suthortites in the field, to provide courses of study for the teachers. This proposal recalls what was once standard practice, namely, the preparation of courses of study by State Departments of Education or by the Superintendent's offices in the larger school systems.

"It has become accepted practice in the past 25 years for classroom teachers to share in the process of curriculum construction. 


