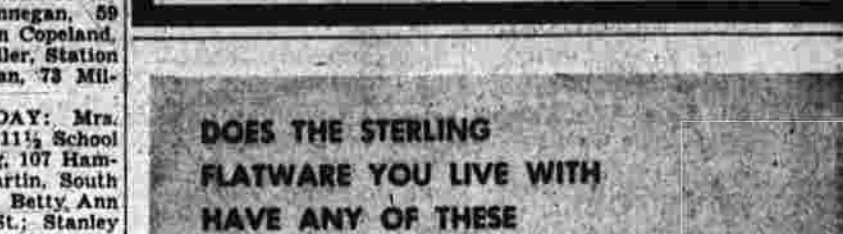

Eisenhower, Eden, Pound Arms Cut, Limit to A-Tests

Washington, Feb. 1 (AP)—The Eisenhower-Eden talks shifted today to questions of disarmament and possible limitations on atomic and hydrogen bomb tests.

These subjects came up in a White House session attended by Harold Stassen, who is President Eisenhower's disarmament specialist and Adm. Lewis Strauss, head of the Atomic Energy Commission.

British Prime Minister Eden and Foreign Minister Selwyn Lloyd met with Secretary of State Dulles, Stassen and Strauss.

Eisenhower was not with them when the meeting opened, but it was understood he might join them later.

Lloyd was used by nuclear cyclotron to the White House from the State Department, where he had conferred for two hours with Dulles on Middle and Far East problems.

Without mentioning specifically any increased U.S. aid, Finance Minister Jose Maria Alkmin today told newsmen.

Brazil, largest and most populous of the Latin American countries, is short on production and transportation.
