



Claims for unemployment compensation in the Manchester area dropped from 856 to 834 during The report also shows a decline in jobless claims throughout the State. The total stood at 21,671 last week compared with 22,771 in the preceding week.

The Rev. Mr. Pimm was made an honorary chief of the Ojibwa. or Chippewa, tribe in the summer of 1952 when he was sent as a mis-sionary to the Red Lake Reserva-tion in Minnesots.

The name, Red Eagle, which in Indian language is Mis-Ko-Ki-New, was given to him during the ceremony because an eagle was the first exciting thing he say when he was ordered by the chiefs to sit outside the tent. The "Red" part of his name was given be-cause of his bright, very un-Indian, red hair.

In his colored alides of the reservation and its inhabitants, the Rev. Mr. Pimm showed the school children how the handsome Olibwa youngsters dress much the same as the Andover residents, with the exception of their gay tribal clothes worn for special ceremonies.

with the exception of their gay tribal clothes worn for special ceremonies.

The Ojibwa Indians use floral designs in their beautifully beaded costumes in contrast to the geometric designs found in the work of other tribes, In the handwork which they make for the tourist trade, they adopt the western designs because the visitors reject the centuries-old floral work as being too modern.

Each costume has eyes worked into the design on every side to watch for evil spirits.

When the white man first came to this area, the Indians found that snuff-bex tops, made of very thin metal, could be rolled into cigarette-like tubes, which they suspend on their costumes in rows. When they dance the tubes jingle with a sound that is music to the Indians' ears. Another adornment they prize highly is a set of jingle-bells to be arorn on the legs.

The Rev. Mr. Pimm explained that the Ojibwa are entitled to wear the Sloux war bonnet since they are the only tribe that ever defeated the Sloux in battle. The original Ojibwa bonnet is built up on the nape of the neck of a deer studded with porcupine quills which is worn down the center of the head from the forehead to the neck.






