A statement handed to foreign correspondents at the Foreign Ministry said: "Any act such as the entry of foreign troops on the terri-tory of nations of the Middle and Near East, without the prior agreement of interested governments and without the sanction of the Security Council of the United Nations, would be a rude disruption of the principles of the United Nations and

the sovereignty of a number of nations." statement was issued as a result of the Eisenhower-Eden declaration in Washington. This expressed willingness to support any U.N. action to preserve peace in the Middle East. There has been talk of an international army to guard the frontiers between Israel and Arab countries.
