Francis Replaces Two Fired Aides

Madrid, Feb. 16 (AP)—Generalissimo Francisco Franco today replaced two cabinet ministers in an attempt to quiet unrest in the Falangist party and halt university student demonstrations against his government.

Decreases dismissing the Secretary General of the Falange and appointing substitutes were published in today's official bulletin.

Francisco was said to feel last week's battles between students and Falangists, which left 20 injured and more than 50 in jail, showed the two ministers were unable to control forces under their care.

The continuing unrest was considered the gravest crisis Franco has faced during his 20 years in power.

Raimundo Fernandez Cuesta, Falange secretary general since 1948, was replaced by Jose Luis Arrese. Arrese had previously held the post from 1941-45.

Education Minister Joaquin Ruiz-Gimenez was replaced by Jesus Rubio Garcia, a Falangist leader.

Madrid's newspapers published long biographies of the new ministers but made no mention of the two ousted officials.

Knoffa to Build Block for Bayer

Those two firms are now located in an adjacent store block. Interior of the stores are being modernized.

Architects for both the Bayer building and the store fronts is Arnold Lawrence.

Ribicoff to Meet New NHRR Head

Hartford, Feb. 16 (AP)—Gov. Abraham A. Ribicoff and New Haven Railroad President George Albert meet today to talk over a Connecticut Public Utilities Commission report which found the railroad guilty of "unsatisfactory performance."

Ribicoff said yesterday that at the Capitol meeting he would seek immediate action from Albert to correct "several shortcomings" in the railroad's operation.

"It is my intention to discuss the PUC report frankly," Ribicoff said. "I hope that we can be assured by the railroad that the several shortcomings in service will be corrected immediately. The New Haven railroad is absolutely essential to the economy of our state and to the people who must use it for their daily work."

In its 28-page report the PUC blamed the "unsatisfactory performance" chiefly on the railroad's operating and maintenance budget which, the PUC said, was cut 11 1/2 million in 1954.

The PUC based its report on its own investigations and on public hearings last August, September and December. At the time Patrick E. McInnis was president of the New Haven.

No New Test Set For Eisenhower

Boston, Feb. 16 (AP)—Dr. Paul Dudley White, the Boston heart specialist who has been attending President Eisenhower, says no future date has been set for another examination of the President's heart.

Dr. White, back home after Tuesday's physical examination of the President, appeared last night on a closed-circuit television program beamed to audiences of doctors only in 54 American cities.

He told a news conference prior to the telecast that the six doctors attending the President have agreed not to elaborate on their Tuesday report which said Eisenhower "should be able to carry on an active life as President for another five or 10 years."

But, without mentioning any names, Dr. White said some heart patients "not only can but should work. Many are unhappy if they are not working. Work is good treatment for some cardiac patients."

CD Aide Plans To Seek Cut in Flood Red Tape

Hartford, Feb. 16 (AP)—Federal Civil Defense Director Val Peterson said yesterday he would keep trying to cut federal red tape in Connecticut's flood recovery and redevelopment projects.

Peterson conferred with Gov. Abraham A. Ribicoff after a tour of the hard-hit Nagatuck Valley area.

Ribicoff, who recently made re-inspection tours of flood-damaged communities, told Peterson he had received complaints from redevelopment officials who claimed their projects were delayed because of what they called bureaucratic red tape on federal levels.

Peterson said he received no such complaints during his tour on the cooperation from the federal government.

"We interpreted the federal aid programs as liberally as possible to permit us to stay out of jail," Peterson said.

But he added that he would do all he could to keep red tape out of long-range development projects in the state.

Peterson said the federal government has spent about \$22 million on Connecticut flood recovery work—such as clearing debris, repairing damaged buildings, replacing bridges and roads and deepening river channels.

He added that the Small Business Administration has approved \$17 million in loans to Connecticut flood victims and that the Red Cross has spent more than \$11 million in this state.
