Rockville, Feb. 17 (Special).—A 44,000-pound steam generator, the largest of its type in the state, has been delivered to the American Dyeing Corp. here for installation in its new \$500,000 plant addition.

The old steel boiler, manufactured by the Tutaville Iron Works, Tutaville, Pa., will produce 20,000 pounds of steam per hour, under 200 pounds pressure, according to the Thomas G. Shaffer Co. of Hartford, who negotiated the transaction.

A spokesman at Shaffer said the cost of the boiler was about \$17,000. It was designed by John P. Legros Associates, Hartford consulting engineering firm, and will be used by the local manufacturing company in processing textiles.

According to Shaffer, the national boiler looks almost a month to travel from the Pennsylvania factory, because of its unusually large size. It was shipped in several sections.

The only boilers in the state larger than this one are those used by power plants. They are constructed on the job, while this particular boiler was shipped partly-made, the spokesman said.

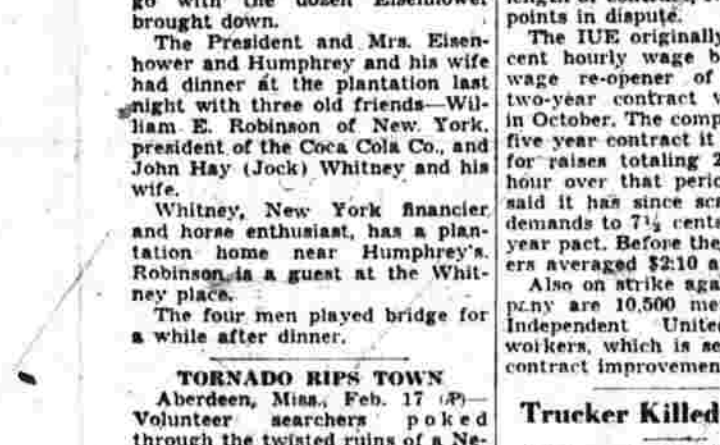

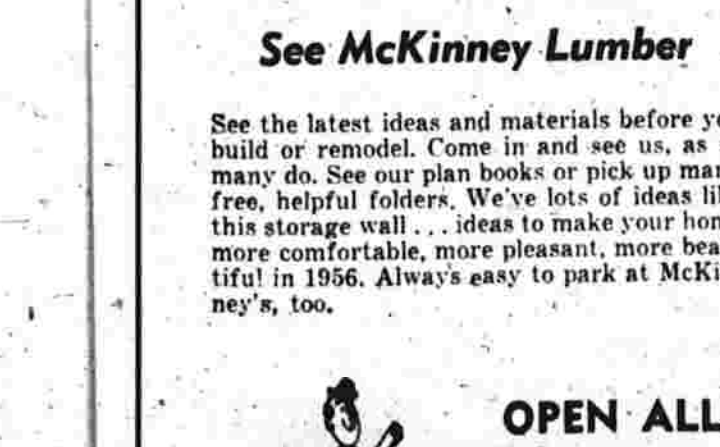

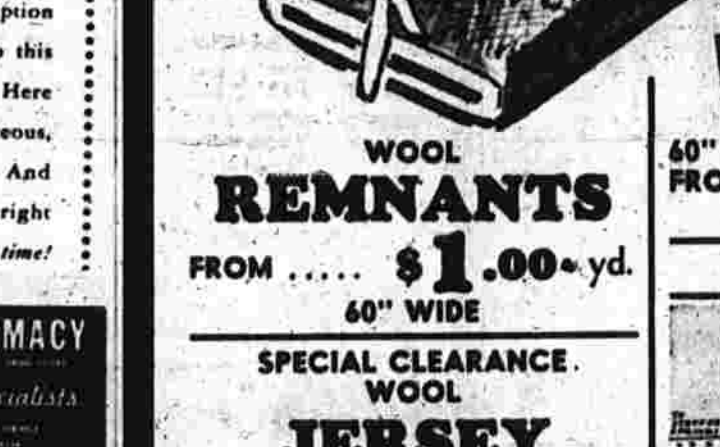
