TV Still Baby in Old Country

New York (NKA)—In the old country, television is slowly but surely making progress. It's still far from being the monster it is here, but Ernest A. Marx, director of the Allen B. DuMont Laboratories' International Division, says that European TV is growing fast.



Most avid TV fans in Europe are the West Germans, here getting a look at new video sets at the annual fair in Düsseldorf.

England is far ahead of all the European countries. England is farthest advanced in TV, Marx says. Mostly that is because they got rolling fast. But the biggest progress is being made in West Germany and Italy. And the slowest is in Austria, Norway, Spain and Portugal.

If you're used to American TV—complete with lavish shows and even lavisher commercials—you wouldn't be happy in Europe. To start with, the vast majority of European TV is non-commercial. And most of it is pretty heavy going—cultural programs, and here and there a dash of sports and a very rare spot of variety.

But even these differ from our commercial programs. There is no such thing as the Montgomery Ward Show, for example. A sponsor doesn't buy an hour and have his own show with his own commercials. He buys spots, strictly. And he never knows when his announcement will be aired, nor during what program.

There are three commercial channels in Europe today, Marx reports. One is the new English commercial channel. The other two are in Monte Carlo and Luxembourg.

So European TV stations have precious little money to invest on jazy forums. All in all, except for sports events and an occasional film show, there is nothing in the programming department to make the average European rush out and buy a set.

The sets are also expensive and far from the fancy furniture U.S. manufacturers offer. They're pretty solid looking affairs, heavy and ponderous.

Further distorting the European picture, according to Marx, are five different transmission systems. If you buy a set in Kansas and move to West Virginia, the set will still be able to pick up the West Virginia TV signals. But, in Europe, if you buy a set

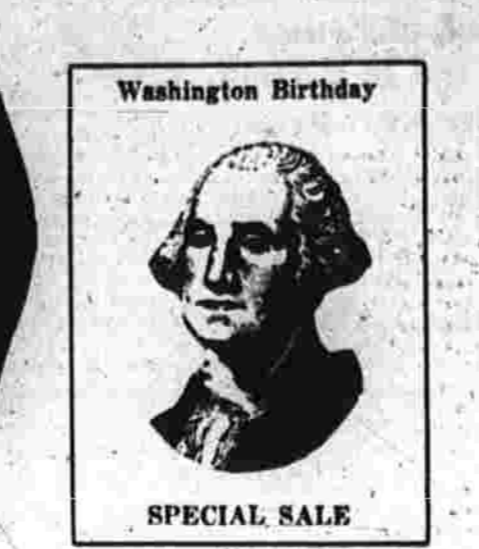

Does Nothing Please Us? The present Soviet hierarchy has turned its oratorical guns full blast on the memory of Stalin.

After all, as the New York Times observes, these same men must have been the "living accomplices" of the bloody Stalin. We had better not be impressed, then, by their seeming virtue in his work.

Nevertheless, our attitude toward things Russian seems somewhat deficient, when it is limited to one of damning them if they do and praising them if they don't. Let us, in a search for a more valid attitude, ask ourselves which we would prefer from the present leadership of Russia—a continuing glorification of Stalin and all his methods and judgments, or a reproduction of Stalin and all his works.

When we put it that way, there is actually only one answer. The milder, more civilized, less violent the leaders of Russia are, the better for everybody. The farther they go from the suspicious and tyrannical bloodiness of Stalin, the better.

Reports from Russia say that the present regime is accompanying its oratory with an actual re-examination of the cases of thousands of Russians who went to prison for political reasons during the Stalin regime. Is this bad? All of this could be done from one angle, if it helps consolidate the Russian regime at home and extend its reputation and influence abroad. This is bad if we assume that it is our mission to keep any Russian government from achieving legitimacy at home and influence abroad, if what we want to do is to keep Russia from having any stable government, or any respectable position in world affairs.

But, we are supposed to be both a rational and a civilized people. And if we are that, what we really wish for the Russians is increased, not less, political and intellectual liberty at home, better government at home and a milder, not a more savage, policy in the world.

Actually, of course, we are continually calling upon the Russians to reform, for their own good, and for the world's. We have called upon them to throw off their chains. We have exposed the lies in their history. One would think, then, that wherever they make a little modest progress in such directions, we would be able to take the line that this is a very good thing, and why not have more of it? If the Russians are finally exposing Stalin for what he was, why not congratulate them, instead of calling it, as did the New York Times, a "trick"?

Kefauver Asks Vote for Youth

Minnesota, Feb. 21 (AP)—Dropping the voting age to 18 cannot bring anything but good for the nation and the time for such legislation is now, Sen. Kefauver (D-Tenn.) said today.

The Senator told a University of Minnesota convocation audience that such a change is needed. "It is only to keep the nation on an even keel," he said.

Age's Vote Disproportionate. "What I mean," Kefauver said in his prepared text, "is that the life expectancy is going up and up, and every year our society contains a larger number of old people. Consequently, the decisions we make at the polls are coming to reflect a disproportionate weight of judgment by the aged."

"We honor them and venerate them. But who can deny that a person's outlook at 70 is different than it was at 20? And who will say that the older viewpoint is better than the younger, or vice versa? "Ideally, we should have a

balance of viewpoints. The best and easiest, and I think the only way to strike that balance, is to lower the voting age to 18 and give youth its chance to be heard."

Kefauver's talk came between visits to St. Paul and Minneapolis industrial plants and a luncheon with university faculty members. He was winding up his 4-day Minnesota campaign tour with a public rally at the labor auditorium tonight.

Peiping Housewife Has Few Luxuries

(Editor's note—Lila Mitchell, a British newspaper writer, has been visiting Communist China and has written a dispatch which was mailed to Hong Kong.)

Peiping, U. S. Mrs. Mo Trung, a middle-aged, rather plump woman with a round pointed face like a good apple, is better off than most women in Red China.

Her husband earns about \$40 a month. Both husband and son come home on weekends. Her husband's head and looking away from home costs about \$8 a month. Mrs. Mo may have about \$50 a month to her household.

House rent and coal cost \$4. She has electricity and a radio set. Food runs about \$12. More than half of this is spent for rice and flour for noodles, mainly of the traditional Chinese meal. The rest goes for meat, and vegetables "fishes". Mrs. Mo's family eats meat and vegetables every day.

Her goal this year is a radio set costing about \$40. Mrs. Mo lives in a typical Peiping house, a grey stone domed of two rooms with a curved tile roof. It faces a courtyard entered by a muddy lane. The courtyard always is festooned with washing hanging to dry.

Soviet Spy Net Covers Free World

New York (AP)—Existence of a vast spy ring operating in the free world, the U.S. included, is reported by an American newspaper, according to a report from a Russian source in the U.S. The newspaper, "Pravda," which is published in Moscow, reports that the spy ring is headed by a Soviet agent, Nikolai Mikhov, who is reported to have been captured by the Germans in 1941.

Details of Moscow's latest efforts to undermine the democracies were revealed by Gregory P. Klimov, a leader of the anti-Soviet defectors, in an interview with NSA Service at the offices of the American Friends of Russian Freedom.

Reds Terrorize Escapes

"Since the end of the war, Moscow has started to terrorize Soviet defectors," Klimov said.

But in recent months the Kremlin's secret police, using secret words and making lavish promises, has launched a new campaign to lure fugitives into the espionage apparatus.

A slight bald-headed man, 27-year-old Klimov is one of the most wanted men in Russia. He was a major in the Red Army when he defected in 1942 to head

the Central Association of Post-war Refugees from the Soviet Union.

Since then Klimov and his associates have been engaged in a bitter, often bloody, fight for the "free world" of the Soviet man. Two incidents are now under FBI investigation.

None of the refugees who returned to Russia is "permitted" to go home, Klimov said. Instead they are forced to go to an espionage school in Potsdam, Soviet-controlled Germany, and are usually sent back West as spies.

"Two of these spies recently turned up in Klimov's Munich headquarters with a plan for helping us to get out of here," he said.

"We are here to spy on you, Mr. Klimov," they said, "please advise us what to do."

To counteract Moscow's propaganda and espionage, Klimov's Central Association of Post-war Refugees maintains its own school for training underground workers.

Frequently, as soon as a Red Army officer or soldier finds a refuge in the West, he is contacted by his friends who remained behind and also writes letters and other anti-Red propaganda material which is dispatched through the Iron Curtain through German underground channels.

Klimov is convinced that the men in the Kremlin fear professional propaganda even more than the H-bomb.

Duchess Unprepared for Storm Romance with Edward Stirred

New York, Feb. 21 (AP)—The Duchess of Windsor says she was "unprepared and unlearning" for the storm stirred up by her romance with former King Edward VIII more than 10 years ago.

In the first installment of her autobiography, published in the current "McCall's" magazine, the former Walla Walla woman writes: "I was unprepared and unlearning."

Her life in love had loved as few women could ever expect to be loved with a great love at stake, a vast empire of wealth and power, a life of unbridled excitement, and a life of unbridled excitement.

Edward abdicated the British throne Dec. 11, 1936, for the woman he loved. His romance with the former King was a storm of passion that produced a great romance throughout the British Empire.
