politicians say it is basically Republican.

But it has a Democratic governor, reasonable Abraham Ribicoff, who seems more popular today than when he was elected and a GOP House.

Yet, voters tend to be independent, tough-minded. They are disgruntled with the town meeting tradition.

Here's what they have been saying in this reporter on major aspects of the coming election:

Ribicoff—plus a prosperity, seems to Republicans, to mean a sure victory in the fall with at least a great majority as he had in 1952, maybe higher. They don't believe his illness will be a drawback.

Mostly Democrats say they hope to cut down Ribicoff's margin, perhaps by half. If so, they say they have a good chance of electing Rep. Thomas Dodd to the Senate next, now held by Prescott Bush.

As for the Democratic presidential candidates, the situation in Connecticut is best described as "fluid." Adlai Stevenson has his admirers here, but so has Sen. Estes Kefauver. In 1952, Stevenson was unable to carry a single county.

Forty recently, Gov. Elwell declared his support for Stevenson and Stevenson asked him to campaign for him in Florida but he refused. Ribicoff says he has not decided.

Results of the New Hampshire and Minnesota primary elections this month could have a profound effect on Connecticut Democrats.

Now the question of Republican candidate for Vice president—more than usual interest this year. So far as Connecticut is concerned, it seems to be Richard M. Nixon. You get that not only from GOP party heads but from the man on the street.

State Chairman Clarence Baldwin, to be sure, said he would not take a position on the question at this time. But he added, "I have a great deal of respect for Nixon's ability and I think he has been an outstanding vice president."
