The traces in the State Welfare Department illustrated something more than the conflict of personalities between the two men, that this was the kind of world in which those who were not with us were against us.

Secretary Dulles has also had other moments in which he seemed to be saying to some of the security officials in Europe, "By that meant that our economic aid might be cut down and withdrawn."

But Mr. Dulles on his present tour of Asia, has advanced considerably in his thinking. He is talking to Indonesia, one of the new Asian nations which has disappeared previously by the name of East Indonesia. Secretary Dulles produced glowing utterances such as this:

"I recall that when the United States was a young country itself just emerged from colonialism we were very eager to devote our efforts and our attention primarily to our own affairs. It is quite understandable therefore that that should be the point of view of the Indonesian Government."

In the same series of pronouncements, Secretary Dulles has been speaking very heavily on the fact that there is no connection whatsoever between the giving of American economic aid and the question of whether or not a nation has consented to come into one of America's military alliances.

It will be seen to the credit of the United States that it is unfortunate that most of even our so-called economic aid, which is restricted to purposes which have military significance. But it is good news, for it means that Mr. Dulles on this tour has been able to carry American official thinking out of that emphasis on the military alliance which has dominated it, and caused it trouble abroad.

This more distant Dulles will be as welcome at home as abroad. Just the other day, one of this nation's leading industrialists, Kenneth C. Wilson, president of the National Steel Corporation, urged just such growth of moderation in our foreign policy. Our foreign policy, with its military alliances, trade restrictions, and unabated hostility does not, he said, represent the "majority thinking of our people."

It does reflect, he said, weakness and lack of confidence in our own system. We believe we can be strong without being thuggish, without being without respect for the rights of everybody think exactly as we do, and our country has not with us, and our country has not with us, and our country has not with us.

I was one of several weary shoppers standing in a fast growing line outside the restaurant of a department store, wishing the lucky ones inside would hurry and relinquish their places to the rest of us. The department in which the line formed happened to be the furniture store, and comfortable chairs and couches were scattered about. How inviting they looked to the footsore and hungry shoppers.

Why did I not take advantage of them? Because a cord was stretched across each one within reach, and a sign read: "For Display Only—Not to Be Used."

THE VOICE OF ALPERT

At the Hartford hearing on regulation of passenger service on our Hartford to Boston line, the voice representing the New Haven Road was that of its new president, George Alpert. But the real voice was that of McGinnis.

From Alpert, Connecticut officials had what was certainly one of the most novel suggestions ever advanced publicly. It was that the financial responsibility for restoring this particular railroad line to service after last summer's floods somehow belong to anybody in the world except the railroad itself. Apparently, if somebody volunteered to finance the cost of repairs to the railroad, it might consider to consider running trains on the line again.

On other lines, the railroad has undertaken its own repairs. "That line, it says, is out of the question because this happens to be a line which lost money anyway in the last year of its operation."

At the same time, Mr. Alpert, apparently with the idea of strengthening his plea of financial hardship, says that the whole road has been losing money for the past two months. But if that is so, why not apply to the whole railroad the logic he applies to this particular line, then he would not be so heavy handed in his application of the rule. Why not, if losing money for one stated period of operation is an excuse for a public utility to go out of business completely?

What is a public utility? It is a private enterprise licensed by the state to serve the public, it is subject to certain conditions and privileges. One of the privileges it has is that of monopoly. Because it usually has a monopoly its rates are regulated. Such rate regulation is designed to protect the public and also to give the public utility a fair return on its capital investment. The rate is based on all the business the public utility does. It is not adjusted to each passenger mile of service the railroad provides, to guarantee that each individual passenger mile can be sold at a profit to the railroad. It is inevitable that any railroad, or any public utility, will make more in some sales of its service than in others. The rates are adjusted to that reality. This may mean, in effect, that one heavily patronized passenger train may pay up subsidizing the operation of one not so heavily patronized.

The reason rates are adjusted, as they are, to cover the operation of some services less profitable than others is that the main object of public utilities is supposed to be service to the public. By the theory which Mr. Alpert is pursuing, the ideal of service to the public would be abandoned. The railroad would eventually divert itself of all operations and services except those guaranteed to the public. To carry it to the ludicrous extreme, no train would ever pull out of any station unless it has a profitable pay load aboard, and if the requisite number of passengers failed to show up, the train would not go home.

But if that sounds ludicrous, it is exactly the philosophy Mr. Alpert, as McGinnis before him, is trying to apply to the Hartford-Boston passenger line.

There ought to be some authority, somewhere, capable of representing Mr. Alpert on what a public utility is, why it exists, and what obligations to the public the possession of a franchise involves.

Rockville School Unit Postpones Action On Shift of Grade 8 Students

Rockville, March 15 (Special) — Action on the possibility of intergrading the eighth grades with the high school was deferred by the Board of Education at a special meeting last night.

The Board decided after considerable discussion, to await further information from the school administration. Such information would include enrollment and predicted enrollment figures, present classroom space and costs of administering the change.

In executive session following the meeting the Board occupied with regard to the resignation of Arthur E. Chatterton, superintendent of schools. Chatterton submitted his resignation last week.

Chairman Morgan Campbell said that several applications for the position both from within and from outside the school system were brought before the Board. A successor to Chatterton will be selected with the Board acting in a unit rather than by naming a subcommittee Campbell said.

The Board also changed the age restriction for students entering school. Under the new policy, children must have reached the age of five before Sept. 1 in order to attend kindergarten, and must have reached the age of before Sept. 1 in order to begin first grade. Previously, the date was Dec. 1.

Discussion on the subject centered around whether a student in his class, and whether or not a year's delay was advantageous. It was the consensus that the younger students are the ones who generally have the most trouble. The Board also voted to mail minutes of its meetings to members of the press.
