O Wind, if Winter Comes...

London, March 17 (AP)—The Kremlin's top Lieutenants in London showed signs of being shaken today by reports leaking out of Moscow that Nikita Khrushchev denounced Stalin as a blundering murderer. The denunciation by the First Secretary of the Communist party was reported to have caused a stir in Thali (Tria), in Stalin's home state of Georgia, protesting the receding of the one-time dictator.

Beirut, Lebanon, March 17 (AP)—Barbadois wiped out two villages and took a total of 127 lives in Lebanon last night. The figures were unconfirmed, but they were the first issued as troops and police toiled through wreckage today in search of victims.

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Manchester residents and others throughout the state were digging themselves out today from the worst blizzard which has struck this part of the country in several years.

The fierce storm blew itself out over Connecticut today, leaving six dead and transportation crippled.

A Wolcott man died when a car skidded into the back of a snowplow. Five Connecticut residents died of heart attacks brought on by overexertion.

Two Manchester men were critically injured when their car struck a bus on Silver Lane in East Hartford.

And local police reported two accidents yesterday, one of which brought minor injury to Roger Hanco, 14, of 21 Drive Y.

Workers in the town Highway Department halted their efforts at 1:30 p.m. yesterday and crew members plowing work this morning shortly after 6 a.m.

Two private cars came together at the intersection of the highway and the town highway.

The Coast Guard, stymied by the night in attempts to reach the imperiled crew, rescued the crew in a two-hour rescue operation as the vicious storm subsided.

In a breeches buoy operation, a line is fired from one point to another. After the line is made fast, men are transferred in a seat by a pulley system.

Other crew members followed Gascara off the Etrusco which was upright in only a few feet of water.

Wind Shift Saves Ship A swift turn in the wind saved the rudderless tanker, Byria, early today.

The launch apparently was a victim of the violent storm that ripped the coast overnight, with winds up to 70 miles an hour.

There was no information from the launch.

Truman arrived here by plane Monday and gave by train today to Saratoga, Pa. for a speech to-night before the friendly Sons of St. Patrick.

On head to greet Truman at La Grange Park were his daughter and future son-in-law, Clifton Dabell, New York newspaperman.

Truman asked whether Margaret would marry into the Truman family, the former President laughed and said:

"I don't think there's a thing in the world to that."

"I'm awfully glad he is a Democrat, but he's Margaret's choice and anyone who's Margaret's choice is okay with me. He suits me fine. He's a fine gentleman."

Truman said the wedding ceremony "are up to Margaret and Mrs. Truman," adding that he would be a fifth wheel at a wedding—except for the groom, of course.

Miss Truman married yesterday after she and other details of her wedding.

Mr. Newman asked whether Margaret's wedding—like that next month of Prince Rainier of Monaco and film actress Grace Kelly—would involve a question of whether you want to get married.

"Well, sir," Truman replied, "you've got and just so long as you're covered up you'll be in the picture."

On politics, Truman had only this to say: "I'm a Democrat and I'll stay a Democrat."

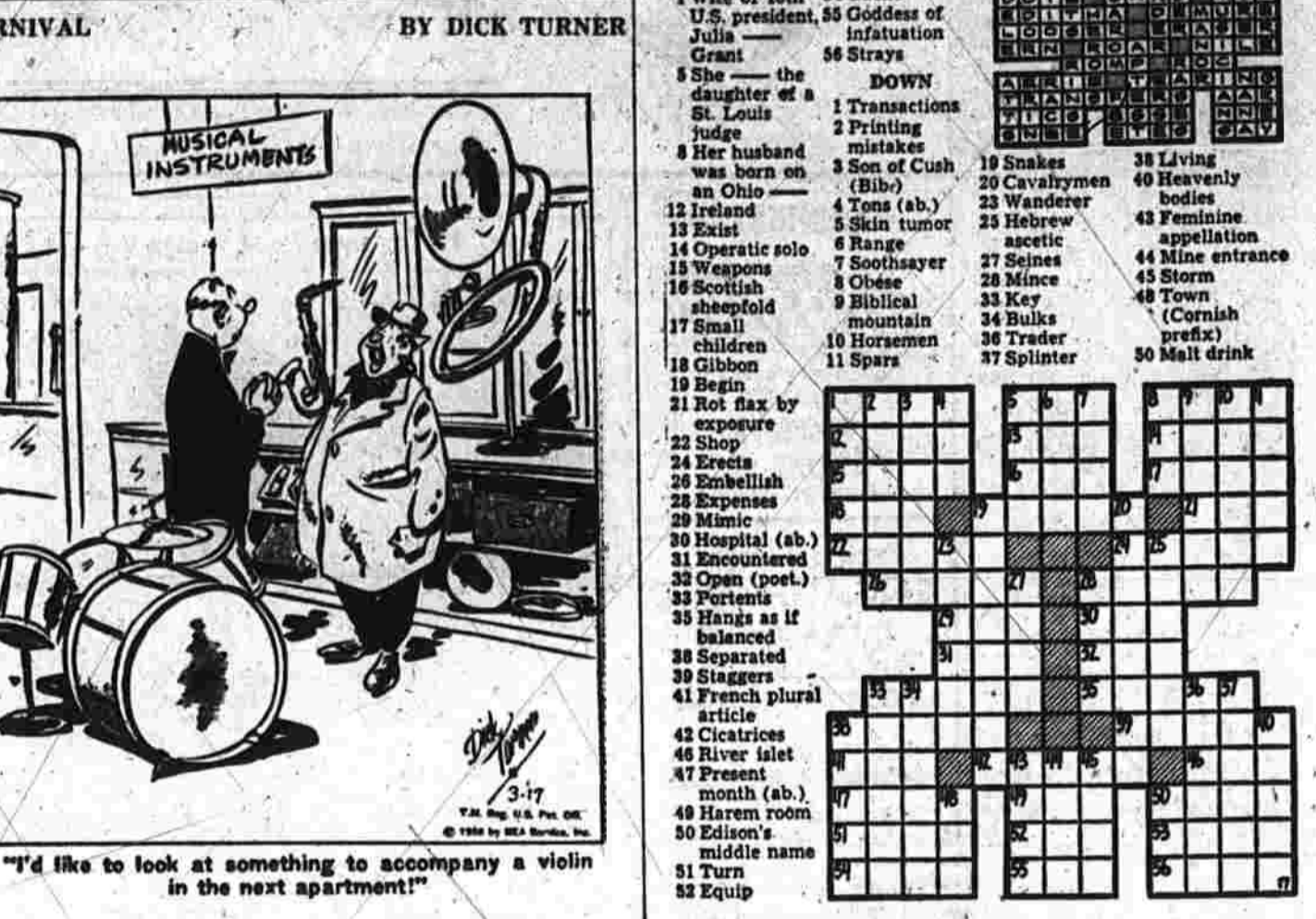

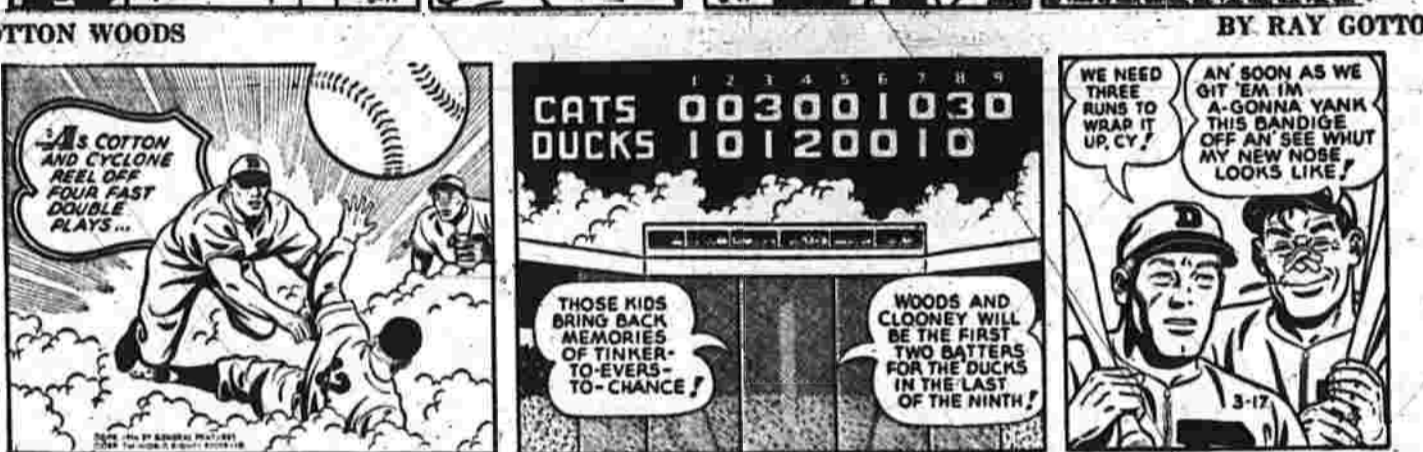

Ah... A Real Sign of Spring

New Blizzard May Add Foot of Snow Here; Storm Belt Leathes Now Nearing 100 Mark

The storm, coming from Manchester and the rest of the state had fully recovered from Friday night's blizzard, causing at least two State deaths, making driving treacherous and kept thousands home from work.

Second of the two worst blizzards to hit the state in years, struck on the eve of spring. According to the forecast, if not the forecaster, spring arrives at 10:21 a.m. tomorrow.

Manchester, where every school was closed, apparently left their cars at home rather than risk getting stuck in a snowdrift.

Despite the efforts of 19 town Highway Department trucks, four streets in Manchester were still impassable.

With nine inches having fallen by the forecast, the blizzard is at least 12 inches and possibly 15. Earlier forecasts said 8 to 12 inches. The predicted depth for March 18 was about four inches less.

Today's school-closing blizzard brought both joy and toil for many Manchester youngsters. For example, Oliver Red, 16, riding alone on his sled David Angotta, in front, and his brother, David, in back, were seen snowed out in three days. (Herald Photo.)

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Gotham Smothered Twice in Weekend

Winter that refused to say die today smothered the metropolis with a second snow blanket of the weekend. It brought the toll of storm deaths to 86.

The storm swept into Connecticut from the South during the early morning hours, progressed northward and hit Boston just about daybreak.

The U. S. Weather Bureau at Boston said the blizzard was a snow storm warning for southern New England and also for the southern portions of New Hampshire.

The storm was expected to move into extreme southern New Hampshire and southwestern Maine during the day. New snow accumulations will be from 6 to 12 inches in Massachusetts from the Connecticut valley eastward and in Rhode Island and southern New Hampshire.

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Storm Smothered State-by-State

Connecticut Schools, many courts and factories closed with up to 15 inches of snow expected before noon. Fall piling on top of Friday's 12 inches made high-tire travel hazardous. Not all roads open. Total deaths in two states 10.

Maine: Southern area expects 6 to 12 inch falling snow. High tide expected to produce high seas and abnormally high tides averaging 2 to 3 feet above normal from Bay Harbor, Maine, to Rhode Island.

New York: The wide area which supplies a large part of the food supply for the Northeast was shut down. Even the usually reliable Long Island Sound ferry service was suspended. One death reported.

Massachusetts: Total fall of 12 inches expected as most schools closed. The forecast of a blizzard work force in six states. Boston International Airport closed. All state roads open. Schools closed in some places. Snow accumulated at Boston suspended. One death reported.

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Town Battles Drifts Since Early Morning

The second death-dealing blizzard in three days was lashing the state today, threatening to dump more than a foot of snow on the area.

The storm, coming from Manchester and the rest of the state had fully recovered from Friday night's blizzard, causing at least two State deaths, making driving treacherous and kept thousands home from work.

Second of the two worst blizzards to hit the state in years, struck on the eve of spring. According to the forecast, if not the forecaster, spring arrives at 10:21 a.m. tomorrow.
