Rockville Killed in Auto, Truck Mishap

(Picture on Page One)
Vernon, March 22 (Special)—A Rockville man was killed and two occupants of a tractor-trailer truck escaped injury late yesterday afternoon in a near head-on collision on Rt. 83 here.
Dead is Lawrence P. Sadaik, 25, 10 Cottage St., Rockville. According to State Police from the Stafford Springs barracks, the car was driving into the front of the truck. Police said the car, traveling south, spun around for some unknown reason and collided with the northbound truck.
The truck then ran over the left side of the front end of the automobile, with the left front wheel of the truck penetrating the car from the right as far as the driver's side.
Uninjured in the crash were John F. Gray, 45, Hartford, the driver of the truck, and his helper, Frank J. Pisto, 31, New Britain. The truck is owned by the Wooster Express, Hartford.
Sadaik's body was partially thrown from the vehicle with his legs pinned under the front seat. His body could not be removed until the vehicles were pulled apart.
Dr. John E. Flaherty, medical examiner, pronounced Sadaik dead of the body to the White Funeral Home, Rockville.
Tolland County Coroner Bernard J. Scherman and County Detective Arthur A. Koss were present at the scene during investigation by State Police. John Pisto, Jr. and John Yaskulka, Sgt. Thomas Yuna and Trooper Robert Scherman also assisted.
Sadaik was a substitute mail carrier at the Rockville Post Office. He was the son of Lawrence and Bernice Hoppock Sadaik, his only immediate survivors.
Funeral services will be held Saturday at 9 a.m. from the White Funeral Home, with a solemn requiem Mass at 9 o'clock at St. Bernard's Church. Burial will be in St. Bernard's Cemetery.
Friends may call at the funeral home tomorrow from 5 to 10 p.m. Sadaik was born in Hartford

Astronomers Probe Stars By Radar Eye

Columbus, Ohio, March 22 (AP)—A powerful new radar eye soon will study invisible shooting stars of space—to learn where they come from and how they affect humans.

Harvard University astronomers today told of plans for the radar study. They hope it can learn secrets of meteors 100 times fainter than those the human eye can see.

Meteors bombard Earth millions of meters from outer space, mostly only tiny specks. Looming the earth every day, it is estimated 1,000 tons of meteoritic dust falls to earth daily. The dust and electrical energy that comes from them may be partial causes of terrestrial rains of the Northern Lights, and aid in sending ordinary radio broadcasts.

The new radar study is expected to produce more facts about the heights, speeds, orbits and origins of these faint meteors, Gerald S. Hawkins, Coffin L. Hervey and Fred L. Whipple told the American Astronomical Society.

The radar system will be set up at Southern Massachusetts Observatory in conjunction with the Lincoln Laboratory of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Consisting of a powerful radar transmitter and six huge receiving antennas to pick up the radar pulses bounced off the meteor and the trail of electrons it leaves in the upper atmosphere.

The system with six antennas receiving the radar echoes is expected to yield more information than has previous radar studies.

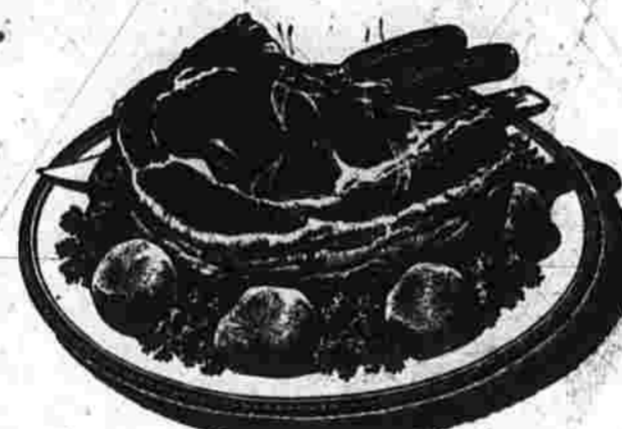

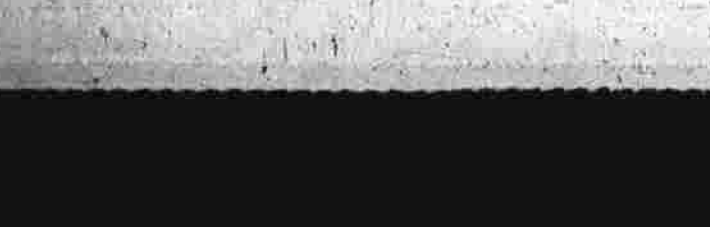
