Faction in Democratic Party Organizes to Unseat Gryk

A group of Manchester Democrats have organized to wrest control of the Democratic Town Committee from Town Clerk William Gryk and his supporters in the approaching party primary May 7, it was revealed today.

The development came just as the Democratic Town Committee is preparing to meet tonight to endorse a slate, presumably consisting mostly of present committee members, for addition as the new Democratic Town Committee.

The list of dissidents includes Atty. John T. LaBelle, Jay Robinson, Harold Garrity, George Lester and Philip Sawyer, according to LaBelle.

LaBelle and Sawyer are members of the present town committee. Also included are Pascal Marzaglio, Mary Anne Kelly, Norman Corcoran and Roger Neveu, all members of the present town committee, LaBelle said.

Spontaneous Movement

LaBelle, one of the leaders of the opposition, described it as a "spontaneous movement of Democrats."

He said the group will present a complete slate of 40 candidates to the Democratic voters when the town committee meets on Monday night.

LaBelle said the insurgents should not be mistaken for the night with the naming of a party-endorsed slate by the town committee. Some of the group plan to be at the meeting, which is scheduled for 8 o'clock in the Municipal Building, however.

LaBelle said the group includes more than 40 persons who are interested in serving on the town committee and some election will have to be made.

He said the group plans to get the signatures of about 600 registered voters to force the primary election. Under the new State law on elections, five per cent of the electorate, or about 300 votes, would be needed.

ident. All factors, this included, are taken into account in determination of Middle Eastern policy.

The spokesman was asked to comment further on a New York report that Britain recently completed a plan for offensive military action in case of a second Arab-Israeli war, with the object of stopping the spread of any such fighting.

"We have plans which could be put into action very rapidly in such a contingency when it has been decided to do so," the spokesman replied.

He made it clear the British government does not envisage acting on its own, however, and he called attention to American, British and French consultations under way in Washington on the Middle East situation.

These three-power exchanges were undertaken to figure out ways of implementing the 1950 declaration under which the United States, Britain and France pledged to resist any forcible attempt to change the Middle East frontiers.

Other British sources said they understood the Egyptian military group is being instructed by Russian experts, although on Polish soil. They said the training started last December and there has been a regular turnover of the Egyptian personnel since.

Under the arms deal, the Cairo government is likely, according to British estimates, to get 300,000 M16 jet fighters, more than 50,000 M48 tanks, and about a half dozen submarines. The supply of small arms is also believed to be the Prague-Cairo pipeline.

French Move to Give Self-Rule To West, Central Africa Lands

Paris, March 23 (AP)—France moved today toward granting self-government to French West and Central Africa and Madagascar. The island has been held under along the pattern forced by Nationalist movements in Tunisia and Morocco.

The National Assembly in a session lasting until about 4 a.m. voted 477-98 to give the government special powers to make a political, administrative and financial changes in the overseas areas. Rightist deputies formed the only opposition.

Tough Opposition Seen

The measure, now going to the Council of the Republic, the upper chamber, is expected to run into tougher opposition there but not enough to give Premier Guy Mollet any real trouble.

Encompassed under the measure are the North African regions of Algeria, Tunisia and Morocco. France has recognized the independence of Tunisia and Morocco subject to a multi-to-be-referred relationship of interdependence in areas of foreign affairs and defense. Both have been ruled as protectorates.

Algeria, governed as a part of metropolitan France, has been promised elections and negotiations toward self-rule. Nationalists in that setting area are waging a bloody fight against the French.

Also involved under the new measure include a combined territory of 257,000 square miles in West and Central Africa. Those French-ruled regions have a total population of 20,380,000 persons. Madagascar, 240 miles off the coast of southern Africa, has a population of 2,700,000 square miles with a population of 4,125,000.

Also involved under the new measure is an almost free hand in ending the division in political and ethnic affairs between European and native populations. It provides for ending the present split of local assemblies into European and native sections. Territorial administrations also may be reorganized either decentralization or re-grouping.

Seek to Hike Living Standards

The bill also authorizes the government to take steps to raise living standards and encourage economic and social progress. Specifically cited were plans to increase agricultural production and private investment.

East Haven, March 23 (AP)—An East Haven man was arrested on a charge of attempted blackmail or extortion yesterday. Police said he was charged with offering to "fix" a court case for \$700.

John J. McMahon, 46, chairman of the Board of Zoning Appeals and a member of the Democratic Town Committee, was released on \$1,000 bond.

Police said restaurant owner Pasquale Florio said McMahon offered to "fix" his case. Florio was charged with breach of the peace on his wife's complaint, and later fined \$100 and given a 15-day suspended jail sentence. On appeal to the court of common pleas the fine was remitted.

McMahon refused to comment on the charge.

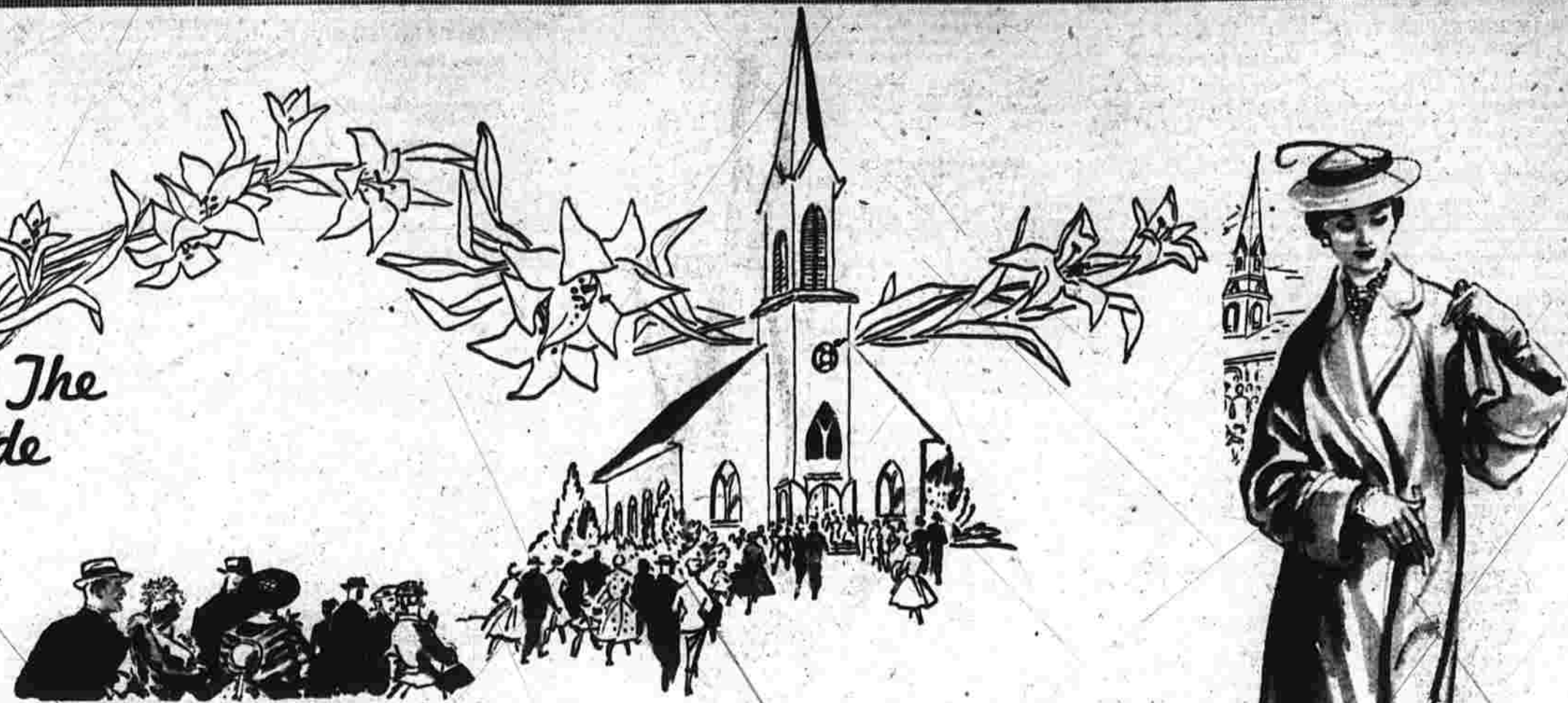
