Coventry Teachers, Board Disagree On New Pay Rate Schedule

Coventry, March 26 (Special)—The Board of Education has refused to recognize the impasse procedure demanded by teachers seeking a higher salary schedule. Board members have voted that an impasse procedure does not exist in the state. The impasse is a device for settling disagreements, according to Chairman Russell D. Potter, who said the revised salary schedule is in the hands of the board. Potter said the board will issue contracts on the basis of the revised salary schedule. \$3,200 to \$5,500, with the maximum to be reached in 13 steps. This schedule has been rejected by the teachers who propose \$3,500 to \$5,500 in 10 steps.

Potter said the board will send a letter to each teacher saying the impasse procedure has not been recognized and that contracts based on the board's revised schedule will be offered.

Letter Quoted

To part the letter states: "An educational interest is endangered. The adoption of a higher salary schedule is a community-wide issue which will affect not only the salary schedule in a community but also the educational interests of the community as a whole. It is the duty of the board to act in the best interests of the community."

Consequently, the board adopted a new salary schedule beginning the 1956-57 school year. 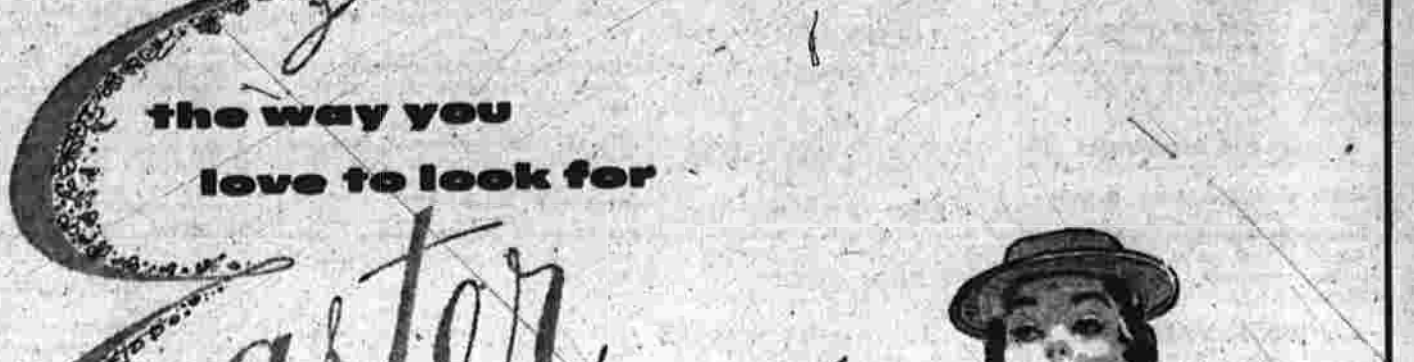
