Student Distribution Studied By Board of Education Here

The territory of those seventh and eighth grade students who will attend classes in the new high school was tentatively carved out last night.

According to a plan endorsed by the Board of Education, most of the junior high school students who will go to the school are those who live north of Middle Tpk. from the New Haven Railroad tracks on the west to Vernon St. on the east.

But the boundary also includes those seventh and eighth graders who live in the rectangle that joins the center St. between Main St. on the west and Walker St. on the east.

The plan involves about 420 students, equally divided between seventh and eighth graders. Another 1,000 junior high school students will be assigned to the new school.

ever was when it was branding the field, who has refused to retire. Perhaps it is a safe thing to be always suspicious, to believe always the worst, but the thing that worries us, not too urgently as yet, but for the potential future is this: suppose the Russians do react to change some. How will we ever know or admit it? How will we derive from it the benefits we desire? We ought to keep some part of our policy apparatus open to those impressions and views which indicate that there may be something real going on inside Russia. For instance, although all our anti-Communist aspects may be unanimous in saying that nothing really is happening, the tortured, disloyal behavior of Communist agents in Russia, as in the American papers, or in the pages of the Daily Worker, would indicate that what is happening is not necessarily so simple as we are led to believe. It is something we ourselves have urged and asked for. Along with the danger that we might be tricked into dropping our guard, there is another and opposite danger. It is the danger that instead of encouraging real change, we might stuff it out. If Russia, after some experimenting in the present direction, should suddenly veer back to its behavior of yesterday, we should be regretful soon enough.

Announcing Aggression
 The news out of the United Nations Disarmament subcommittee meeting at London continues to be almost farcical. Mr. Stassen's latest headline proposal—one calls it his because of some preferential reference about attributing it to the administration which President Eisenhower would not even touch—was that the powers of the world agree to limit their armaments. It would seem that there would be nothing but dismay arising out of it if it did not happen to discover that there has been a real change of some kind inside Russia. It would seem that we drew the idea of any change in Communist behavior than we have dreamed Communist leaders.

One reason for this is simple. A good many of us are suspicious of the Russians, and we are afraid they may trick us into Americanism into thinking they have changed when they have not. So part of our continual reassurance to ourselves that the Russians have not changed is in reality more a warning to ourselves than anything else. Even President Eisenhower, perhaps our most moderate influence in the foreign policy field, feels constrained to warn us that the sinister aims of the Kremlin have not been dropped. He warns us that because he considers it necessary to keep us on the alert, and in the mood to support those military and economic measures which are part of our constitution of the Communist menace in the world.

But this genuine fear that we may let down our guard before the Russian smile is only one part of the motivation behind our continued assertions that nothing has really changed. A lot of people have made a life and career, in these past 10 years, exposing and denouncing Communism. They are professionals at it. And when they confront the possibility of some change inside Russia, they not only have that possibility with suspicion, because of what they know of the Russians, but also with invidious enmity, because, if true, it might bring their careers to an end. They would fight against believing it even if the evidence of real change were overwhelming, which it certainly is not as yet. Anti-Communism is their pastime, their life cause; many of them have added emotional experience of having been Communists themselves and then turned to freedom. They can't believe the Communists are changing, even though they themselves are Communists who have changed; they couldn't stand believing it, either.

All this is going to be illustrated, soon, by a project of the House Un-American Activities Committee, which is itself an organization which would lose its cause for being if Communism should ever really return itself. With possible justification for its own continued existence obviously in mind, this committee is now calling a panel of noted experts on Communism, to analyze present events inside Russia and inside Communist theory, and come up with a verdict. The list of experts being called is heavily dominated by those individuals who have conspicuously made a career of anti-Communism. One can wager, in advance, that their report will justify future life both for themselves and the committee by finding that nothing has really changed inside Russia, except that the Communist plot has become more subtle, clever, insidious, and therefore more dangerous than it
