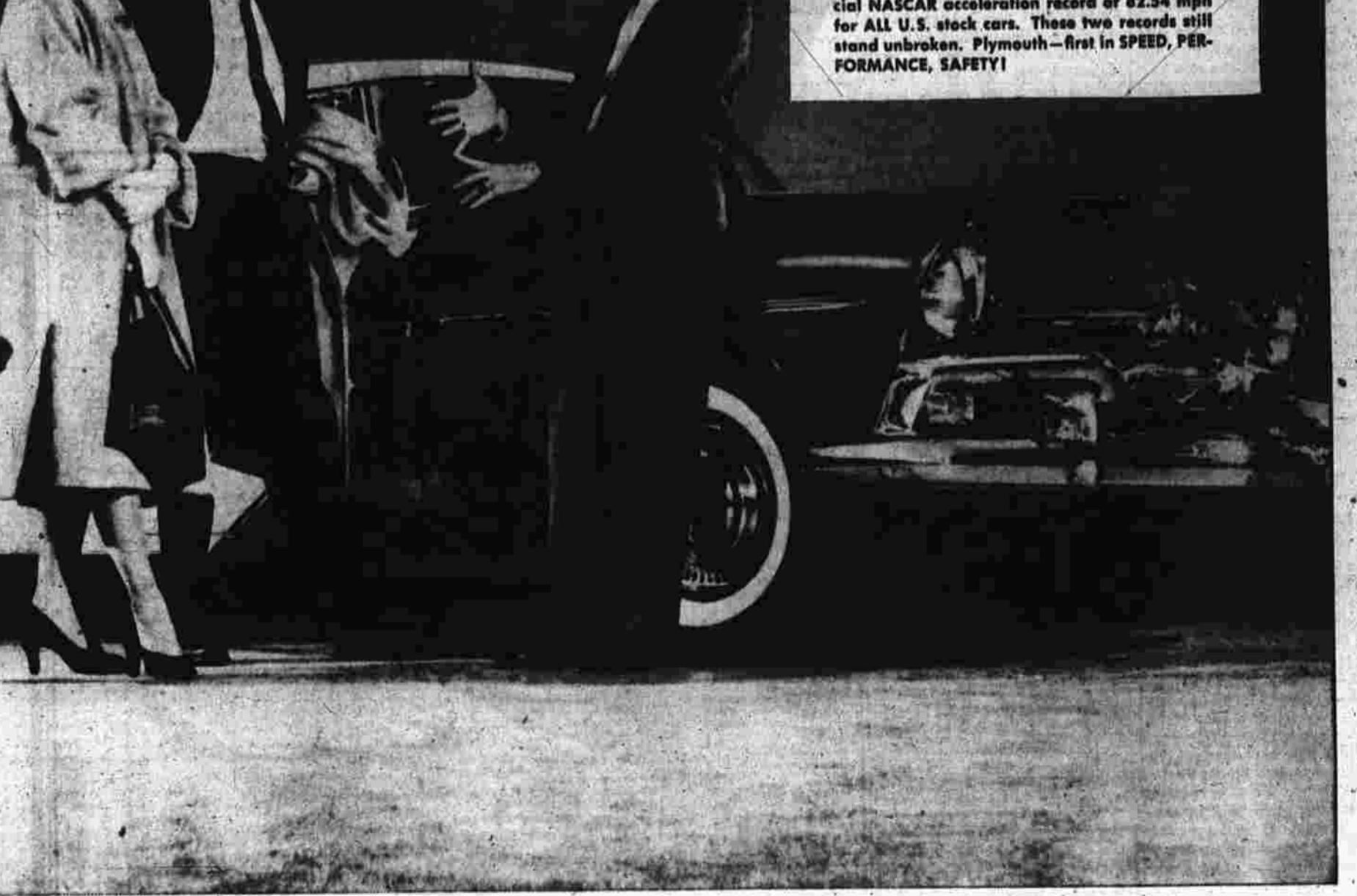

But the problem of a garment supplier are different from those of a cloth manufacturer. With a firm like Manchester Modes, every foreman must know a good deal about tailoring. This latter trade is slowly becoming a lost art, Bell says.  
Since the local company places great emphasis on quality, fine tailoring is the key to success. A garment can't be spotted by slight imperfections during the manufacturing process. To spot the trouble takes a trained eye, and it is because of this that the men with tailoring background become necessary.  
Another complication is that garment manufacture is still largely a matter of skilled hand work all along the line. Machinery has not been invented to take the guess work out of the process as quickly as in some other lines of industry.  
This may be because many garment makers are still relatively small firms and machinery makers have neglected the market. In any case, the clothing at Manchester Modes is made for the most part on batteries of sewing machines—late models to be sure, but basically little different from earlier types.  
Aside from these headaches, there is the problem of "shade offs." This term is applied to bolts of cloth with different shades of the same color. All parts of one garment must come from the same bolt of cloth.  
So, as the parts of a garment are cut from several thicknesses of cloth from one bolt, each of the parts is assigned a code number designed to keep it available to be assembled with others from the bolt.  
Thus, mass production in its usual sense is difficult. Ordinarily, mass production assumes complete interchangeability between similar parts.  
If someone could invent a dyeing method which would assure uniformity of color from bolt to bolt of cloth, his fortune would be assured, Bell thinks.  
But—"All God's chillun got troubles," as the saying is, "and these problems are probably of little concern to the woman trying to choose her wardrobe for Easter. Next Sunday, an untold number of Manchester Modes coats and suits will lend color to the scene across the land."  
Founded by Jacob Ellis  
The company, founded about 50 years ago by Jacob G. Ellis, has been working at top speed recently to catch up with Easter season orders. The firm's 275 employees will get a breathing spell after the holiday, and then the pace quickens again in the summer months to get ready for fall buying.  
Bell says Modes uses some imported fabrics but most of the "zip-out" coats, suits, storm coats, and other women's outer garments are made from domestic fabrics. Prepared for a production, he thinks tweeds will be popular for fall.  
However, he said, he can't be sure. It is such uncertainty which means the company's production has to be so flexible that it can be switched from one model to another at a moment's notice.  
Anywhere along the line of the manufacturing process—from the time garment components are cut from stacks of cloth until the clothing is pressed for shipment—changes can occur as the result of information from the field. Modes has a staff in New York, the center of the garment trade in the United States, to keep posted.  
Sidney Ellis President  
But the headquarters of the company is here in Manchester and Sidney Ellis, Jacob Ellis' son, is president. The firm moved here from New Britain in 1937, Bell says.  
Like most sections of the textile and garment business, the company has had an uneven history, with its peak in the late 1920s and during World War II. As war introduced unusual conditions with a good many enterprises, it was introduced under conditions and Bell thinks the firm's present size makes it more competitive.  
Located in a building which formerly housed Cheney Bros. operation on Pine St., Manchester Modes is one more firm, among many here, which believes in quality. While this emphasis has often meant somewhat slower growth,

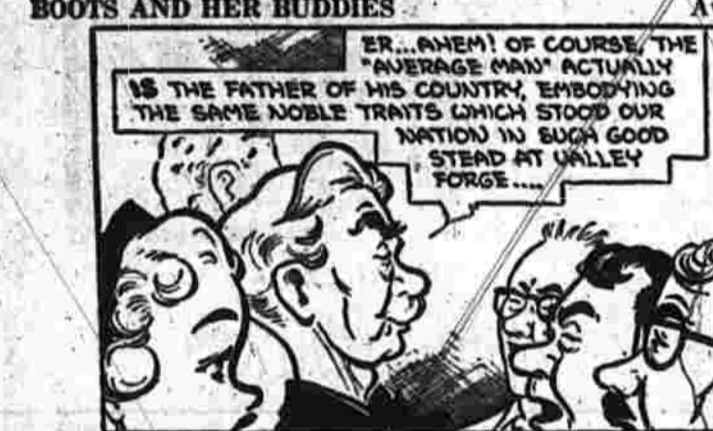

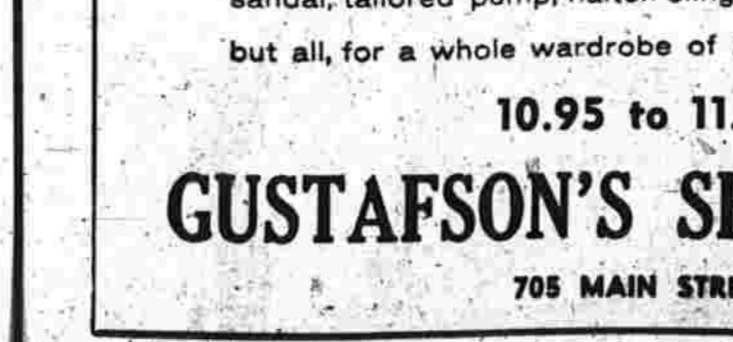
