Manchester Man Fined in Columbia

Columbia, April 12 (Special)—Edward J. Fitzgerald, 41, 23 Brain and 21, Manchester, was found guilty of breach of peace and fined \$100 in Columbia Circuit Court this week.

A charge of operating a motor vehicle without the owner's permission, however, was held.

Fitzgerald was arrested by State Police Richard Powers of the Colchester barracks early Sunday morning when an automobile, registered to Fitzgerald, was found driving on a highway.

The automobile was owned by Thomas Hespney, 28, Maple St., Manchester. Hespney lodged the complaint of operating without permission at the time of the investigation.
