

Our German policy—a thing which could never win because it defied history, instead of following the inevitable flow toward its inevitable failure.

The foreign minister of West Germany announced after consultation with Chancellor Adenauer, that West Germany will soon make its first direct approach to Russia on the question of German reunification.

The official response of Western diplomacy to this is that the West Germans can talk with the Russians if they want to, but that they can't settle anything concerning their own national fate unless we approve.

This is a sort of last-dying gasp from our policy. If the Germans should ever get what seemed to them a good bargain from the Russians, they would take it, no matter what we thought of it.

The fundamental error in our German policy has been that we have been betting that the Germans would rather remain part of Germany as a formal ally of the West than remain a neutral.

When the Germans worried about reunification, we told them that they were to get it, and arm and join us, with one half of their country.

Now they have gone through the legal motions of voting to re-arm and joining us, and it appears that this, if it does anything for reunification, blocks it instead of producing it. And it appears also, that we of the West have absolutely no power or influence of any kind to bring about German reunification.

All along, there has been an assumption that if the Germans swap German rearmament and alliance in for German unity, we would come to stay stuck with our own policy.

Now West Germany itself may make that bargain, and we have absolutely nothing to give the Germans, while the Russians have the key to the one thing the Germans inevitably want most. 35 Civilians to View H-Test from 50 Miles

Washington, April 15 (AP)—The first top government civilian observer to see one of the hydrogen bomb tests scheduled for 10 miles above or in the sea setting off an unlimited, unconfined chain reaction. The scientists say no reason for that worry. They were right. The shots exploded as predicted, and no one was hurt or contaminated.

The safety rules that applied for the old model-E atomic bombs don't fit the hot rod models of today.

Results Ample Evident
 In 1952, they tested the first true hydrogen (fusion) bomb. It irradiated an Atoll island instantly, left a crater in the ocean floor a mile in diameter and 175 feet deep. The larger test of March 3, 1953, left not only evidence but some of the debris, which was scattered by an unexpected wind shift, spread a volume of radioactivity outside the estimated zone of danger.

A Japanese fishing boat was overruled by the first decision on "operation crossroads." The scene was the same—Bikini atoll. The weapons were different—two "fission" nuclear weapons yielding only 20,000 tons (20 kilotons) of force in 1946 compared with the multimillion ton hydrogen weapons of today.

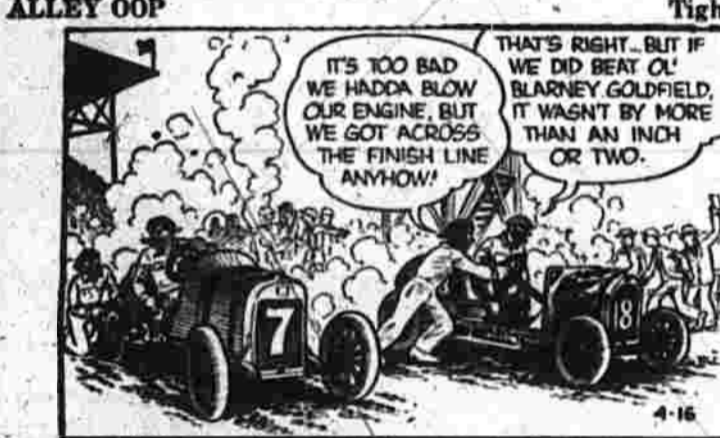
