place and the trappings, as he had them smiling and laughing to no end.

Before Rainier received the heads of a number of foreign delegations bringing gifts. One of these was a highly unofficial group of British seamen from the frigate survey ship Dalrymple.

Ordinary seaman Alan Roberts of Liverpool, presented his highness with the ship's crest and six woven Maltese cushions. Rainier was said to have thanked the ship's officers and company as warmly as if they'd brought him a royal navy yacht.

21-Gun Salutes

Monaco was jolted by 21-gun salutes from three naval ships arriving in the harbor at 10:30. They were the U.S.S. Heermann, the Kermit of France and Britain's Tormentor. The Italian destroyer Afrona was due later in the day.

The guns of the Prince's fort answered with 21 shots to a country on the ride around in 30 minutes on a bicycle the effect was shattering.

Last night was given over to an unprecedented girl talk. Grace was hostess to her bridesmaids at a party in Rainier's palace. The Prince, who is living at his villa until after the wedding, was present for awhile, but the occasion was strictly for the girls.

The State Of NATO

The sudden news of the retirement of General Alfred M. Defiance—And Surrender

By DROGGER

President Eisenhower did two things yesterday. He vetoed an impossible farm bill, which was an act of political courage, since not only the Democrats but many of his own farm state Republican leaders were demanding that it be signed. And, having acted thus with political courage, he proceeded to act with political acumen and political strategy to soften the political consequences of his act.

In other words, the politics of the farm problem got to him, and he defeated him, to some extent, even while he took up headlines for defying politics.

His surrender after defiance came in his action, reviving up-wind existing price supports for wheat, corn, cotton, rice, peanuts and dairy products to a level which will cost the taxpayers \$800,000,000, and channel that amount into farm pockets, and add no one knows how much to the surpluses already existing and already constituting the basic dependence in the farm problem.

His surrender also included a new and unexpected promise to the corn producers that they can grow all the corn they want and still get a high subsidy for it.

This is intended to be a special reason for the corn-belt regions which have been hardest hit by falling prices.

His surrender also included a proposal that, if Congress would now pass a soil bank bill, it include a provision by which farmers could receive a payment of half their benefit, now, before they had even begun to carry out the program.

All these surrenders are, too obviously, designed to put money in farm pockets before November, when we vote.

The blame for such surrenders on the part of the President is relative. After all, what he has done is a good deal short of what his political opponents proclaimed themselves willing to do. He has struck something of a compromise, where Stevenson and Eisenhower favored going the whole irresponsible limit represented by the ridiculous legislation passed by Congress. His own bid for the farm vote is more responsible, restrained, and moderate than theirs.

But there is a tragedy and a failure involved, nonetheless, it is that, admitting that the farmers need and deserve better income, the President has also been forced to admit that, for the present, there is no way of getting more money in the farmers' pockets except to have the taxpayers themselves put it there directly.

The Eisenhower farm program tried to negotiate a gradual escape from this principle. It tried to cure the problem in some basic fashion. But the cure, if it was one, has not had time to work, and an election year, necessary to ease the pain has made even the President reach back for the old and non-curing palliative, the higher subsidy.

That even he, even if reelected, will go back to decreasing the subsidy he has now increased again, is doubtful. There has not been time enough between elections to give the sound approach a fair trial. Now most of the ground that may have been gained has been given up again. Somebody may weather the election, but the farm problem will be awaiting the winner, as his, as a costly, as desperate as ever. 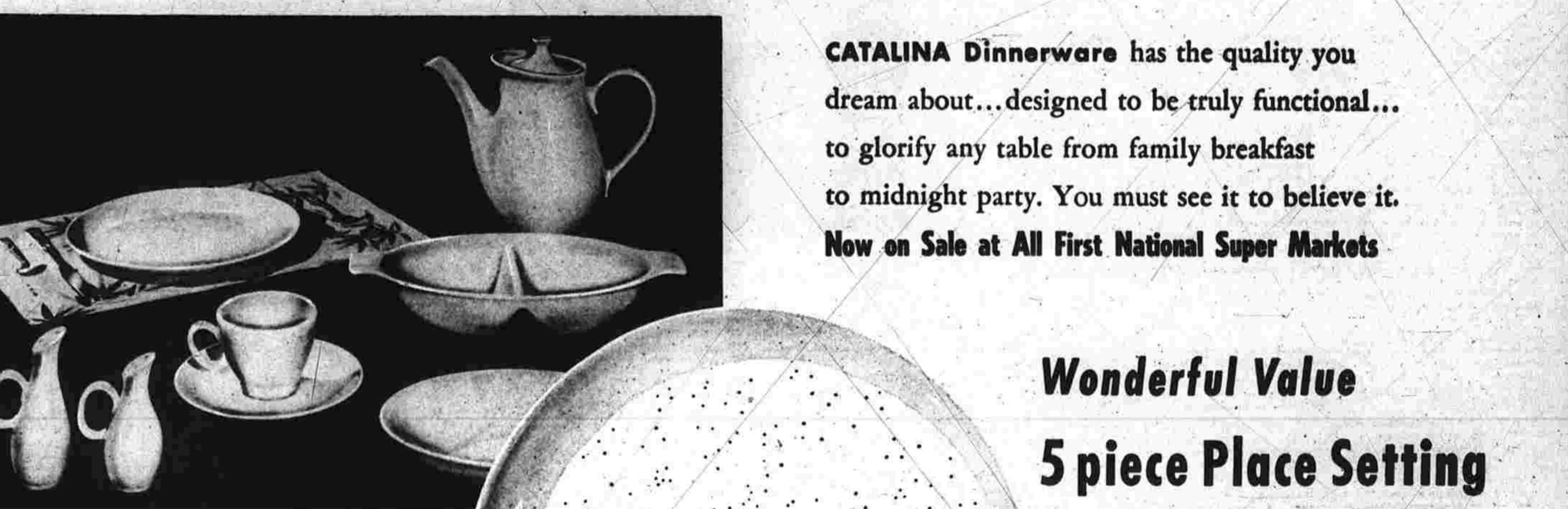
