



WHAT IS A PRIMARY?

When you register with a political party you gain the right to have your say in how that party should be run, who its leaders will be and who will be nominated to run for office. A primary is an election in which ONLY registered party members can vote. The kind of primary we have had in Manchester in the past has been the kind to nominate candidates to run for office. We have been fortunate that this primary was provided for in our town's charter as many communities do not have this privilege.

WHAT IS A TOWN COMMITTEE?

This year a new state law is in operation which permits us to have a primary election to pick the party leaders, or the Town Committee, as it is called. This Town Committee is like the executive board of a club or organization. It is in charge of managing the affairs of the party and it must operate under party rules. The members of this Town Committee are usually considered to be the spokesmen for the party. If you have an efficient, well-run Town Committee with members of a high caliber you can expect to have a successful, well-respected party.

This is an important privilege since your Town Committee has a great deal of influence in making the pol-icy and setting up the platform on which your candidates will run for office in town elections. 
