Andrei Vishinsky Criticized Trial by Confession Hit In Soviet Law Journal

By STANLEY JOHNSON Moscow, April 21 (AP)—The standard Soviet practice of trial by confession, which served Stalin well in an earlier time, has been denounced in Russia's leading law journal.

The magazine Soviet State and Law labeled the procedure a "glaring violation of socialist legality." It roundly criticized the late Communist Party secretary, who was the target of the purge trials of the 1930s in which many veteran Bolsheviks were convicted on their own confessions and put to death.

Vishinsky, who was the chief Soviet delegate to the United Nations, said the article "variance with the demands of socialist legality." In line with the current campaign to take the emphasis away from Stalin, the Soviet Union paid today the 80th anniversary of his birth.

Moscow was festooned with flags and newspapers carried four-mile parades in honor of the 80th anniversary of Lenin's death.
