Democrats May Give Meyner Second Spot

Washington, April 26 (AP)—Gov. E. A. Meyer's show of strength in last week's New Jersey primary has revived speculation he might figure prominently as a competitor for the Democratic vice presidential nomination.

Although the only active contest so far is for top place on the 1956 Democratic ticket, nearly a dozen governors and Senators, and at least one mayor, have been mentioned for the second spot. That place was occupied in the 1952 election by a Senator, Sen. John Sparkman of Alabama.

Geography Seen Factor

Of course, talk about a vice presidential nominee for the party end of power rarely reaches the serious stage until convention time, and after a decision has been made on a party standard bearer. The presidential candidate usually has a lot to say about a running mate. Geography is another big factor.

For example, Gov. Meyer, whose untolded delegate almost crushed one favorable to Sen. Keating of Tennessee in last Tuesday's New Jersey voting, would appear to have a better chance to win a ticket headed by a Midwesterner such as Adlai Stevenson, or from the neighboring state of New York.

Meyer also has been mentioned as a possible dark horse candidate for president in event of a convention deadlock, although he has disavowed any ambition to be the national ticket.

Whatever his desires, Meyer's friends say he can now go to the national conclave in a strong bargaining position.

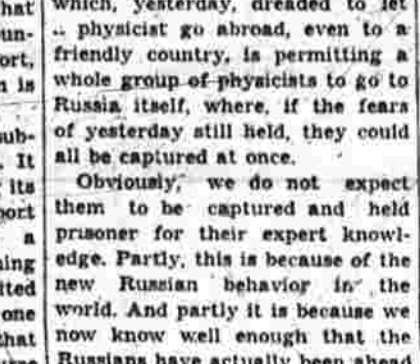

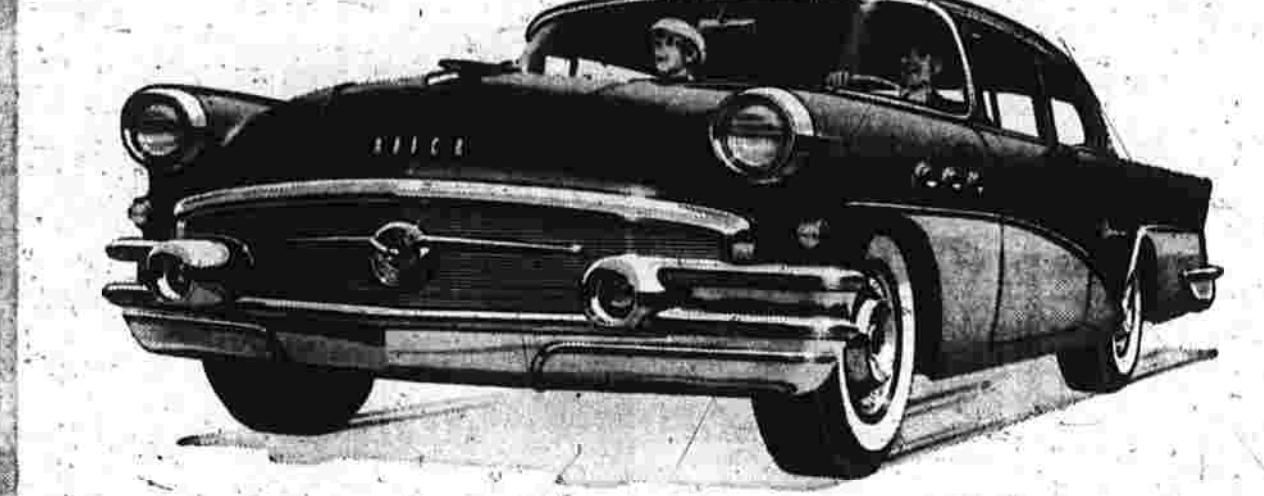
