### Judge Scores Juvenile Acts

Gray, in discussing the recent case of Raymond, 17, 46 Dudley St., told Prosecutor William LaFollette, "Don't bring me any more cases of this type. I'm going to sign a law to take care of them."

The parties held primaries on their own in the capital in 1952 but they amounted only to popularity contests. There was no law to give force to the results though the candidates who won the voters favor did go as delegates to the Democratic national convention.

This time the voting was held under a new statute.

In other political developments: An Associated Press poll showed Stevenson now leads Kefauver 63 to 76 in publicly committed delegates but the Democratic nomination is not counting yesterday's election.

But Democratic delegate with another 213 votes so far have not revealed their preferences, leaving the relative strength of Stevenson and Kefauver still in doubt. The Democratic convention total will be 1,372 votes, with 884 needed to nominate.

Back on the campaign trail Stevenson in Kansas City, Ore., urged his "grayway" critics of the Eisenhower administration, while Kefauver was in Florida suggesting that U.S. military preparedness should be limited only after a proper disarmament agreement can be secured and made effective.

Stevenson charged the administration has "gone away" while Kefauver's "grayway" critics are "able natural resources." He also described Sen. Morse (D-Ore.) as one of our "greater resources."

Kefauver, fighting for votes in Florida's May 29 primary, said the U.S. should cooperate in "any genuine effort to limit the arms race," but advised keeping our powder dry until unfriendly nations show more cooperation.

Both candidates are vying for delegate votes in Oregon (16) and Florida (28).

### USSR 'Salesmen' See U.S. as New Prospect

Washington, May 2 (AP)—One thing ahead through the busy bustle of business at the Moscow airport this week was everybody who is anybody in Russia kissed Premier Bulganin and Communist Party boss Khrushchev.

The two Red leaders, returning from Berlin, were greeted with affection after the cool reception there, seen determined to improve relations with the West or give a good impression of trying.

They could have arrived home in a huff. It wouldn't have been surprising. The British Socialists had needed Khrushchev to help them top. And their talks with Prime Minister Eden were not, according to reports, overly successful.

Just as soon as they alighted from their plane, they gave a thumbs up to the British and then turned their full gaze on the United States like two traveling salesmen getting ready for a new customer and hardly able to wait.

If the United States and the Soviet Union show good will, Khrushchev said, they can make a lot of progress in improving trade and cultural relations and solving the disarmament problem.

These two men, Bulganin and Khrushchev, with their trips to Yugoslavia, Asia and Britain, have been to a lot of trouble to make Russia look like a friendly neighbor on the street of nations.

There is danger of underestimating them. It is usual in this country to be suspicious and even scornful of the Russians. The suspicion is natural since Khrushchev himself has said Communism's aim remains the same: To Communize the world.

But soon to be out of date. The Russians are no longer backward. They are next to this country in industrial development. TOM BRADY poll analyst. And in the past couple of years they have shown initiative and imagination.

What effect their coming with their new tactics may not appear for a year or five years or a decade. In this country the habit is to judge the success or failure of foreign policy in terms of months or at the most four years.

Every four years the administration, Democratic or Republican, has to justify its foreign policy before the voters. But time has a different meaning for the Russian leaders. They are not available at any given moment to the Russian people.

And, since they operate on the theory that Communism will win out in the end, they can't think in terms of the next election. Bulganin and Khrushchev are moving fast but they still don't act like men in a rush.

### State GOP Picks Delegates Tonight

Hartford, May 2 (AP)—Republican voters in caucus throughout Connecticut tonight to endorse delegates to the GOP State Convention for the election in November.

The caucus will endorse 500 of the 630 delegates. The remaining 130 will be endorsed Thursday at party meetings in 26 State Senatorial districts comprising two or more towns.

The caucus will be held for the first time under the rules of the State's primary law.

The delegates can only be endorsed under terms of the law. If any Republican wants to challenge the endorsements in his town or district he must file an opposition certificate by May 28 and a primary must be held.

The primary—if any result—will be held June 6.

If there is no opposition to the endorsements, then the endorsed delegates go to the convention.

In the past, the party organization through caucuses or meetings, picked the delegates.
