all over, there were five policemen at the hospital and an estimated 170 students crowded into city hall cell rooms to await arraignment. A "mat for my road block" was set up on busy Locust St. during the after dinner hours by a quartet of undergraduates who had become bored with playing "alibi" in the hall.

The boys started throwing debris from a partially raised building into the street. Soon they were joined by a crowd of curious fellow students who had wandered out of neighboring buildings along fraternity house row.

In no time, police radio cars were converging on the scene of a reported major traffic jam. When the officers started "breaking" it up, they were greeted with a chorus of boos and a barrage of eggs.

As the situation began to take the appearance of a minor riot with some 300 milling students crowding the intersection and small household items joining the egg bombardment, the officers promptly carried out more than two dozen students to the nearest precinct.

With the aid of the hastily summoned dean of men, George F. Peters and Gene Gishburn, vice president of students, the police appeared to have ended the disturbance.

But no sooner had they departed when it started anew. First the road block again. Then a false fire alarm followed by another.

This time the cops came back in force. Those arrested were being moved the safer from the street.

Faced with an egg shortage, the students resorted to other missiles including some good sized stones. One policeman returning to his patrol car found four eggs in the air out of his tires. In their haste to escape in their own auto, they dented a fence on the police car.

With the outbreak going full force, hundreds of police entered the fraternity houses, handcuffed and chained students to each other and started sending them en masse to city hall for fingerprinting, photographing and official notation.

All were to be arraigned on disorderly conduct, breach of peace and inciting to riot charges. Some faced charges of assault and battery.
