



The AEC announced yesterday it was granting construction and nuclear fuel permits to Consolidated Edison Co. of New York and Commonwealth Edison Co. of Chicago.

Commonwerith expects to build a 45-million-dollar reactor or atomic furnace, in Grundy County, Ill., about 50 miles southwest of Chicago. In neither case does the cost estimate include land or transmission facilities. Both plants are scheduled for comple-
