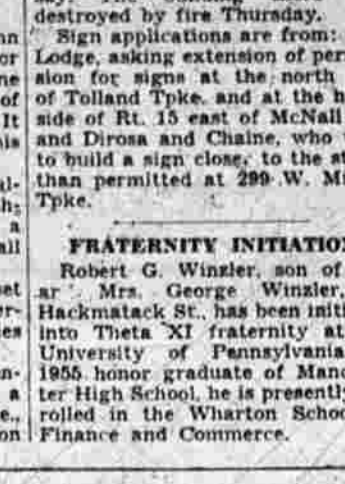

Repairs at Camp Nearly Finished

The work on improvements and repairs at Camp Merris-Wood, the girl scout camp on Gardner St., was just completed by two crews of volunteers over the week-end, according to Edward G. O'Brien, chairman of the girl scout camp committee.

Last Thursday, for the first time, the water running into the cabin got water into the cabin and down to the picnic area. It was necessary to install a new pump, over which a wellhouse had to be constructed.

Other work completed around the camp includes a cement slab placed in front of the back steps, the dumping of many tons of gravel on the path from the parking lot to the cabin to provide better drainage and better footing in bad weather, the digging of two new wells and the construction of a slab for a garage house to be made at a later date.

The crews of volunteers, many of them fathers of Browns and girl scouters have also put in two septic tanks, painted the tool shed and latrine gray, built and painted the two picnic tables, and also painted some of the old ones. They re-erected the tent platforms on utility poles and painted them and have put slaps from the front of the cabin to the picnic area.

Much general cleaning up around the campsite has been done, and considerable wood has been cut and piled for the use of campers.

As chairman of the camp committee, O'Brien had the job of securing the help, both in man power and material, and to make these many improvements at the camp, which is used constantly by the hundreds of girl scouts in Manchester. Facilities at the camp have been greatly enhanced and the general appearance of the campsite has been greatly improved when all cleaning up is completed.

O'Brien stated today that his job will be just about completed, for the time being, when the tent will be used at the day camp set up on Saturday, June 16, a week before the opening of the dog camp season, on June 23.

sharply about some of these things because they happen to be things in competition with the Air Force's concept of its own role.

When the Air Force attacks giant Navy carriers like the Forrestal as nothing but vulnerable sitting ducks, for instance, there may be much to that argument. And the Air Force attack on enemy planes could release the enemy toward its target while still beyond the reach of the Nike, may have something to it.

But the Air Force is jealous in one instance, because a Navy carrier is actually an air weapon, which the Air Force thinks it can provide without the liability of top carrier itself.

And it is jealous in the other instance because the Army, with its missiles, is taking over the business of trying to stop something in the air, which the Air Force thinks should be within its own province.

But while it scoffs at the Nikes, the Air Force maintains that our continental safety from enemy air attack belongs in its own hands, with a missile of its own which has not yet proved itself, and with large reliance on the new radar shield across Canada. But there are military critics who say that this costly radar shield is of small value, and that even the Nike, with its deficiencies, would have a better chance of getting an attacking plane than would even the defense fighter planes of tomorrow.

The Santee Decision

In the decision of New York State Supreme Court Justice Walter Lynch, Wes Santee lost his case against the Amateur Athletic Union, and he also lost his last claim upon any public sympathy. —The court cites, the opinion reads, "the behavior of plaintiff in his failure to proceed as indicative of his bad faith in this entire proceeding. Nowhere in plaintiff's pleading is there any allegation that as a member of the A.A.U. he duly abided by its rules and regulations. That point was studiously avoided as was his appearance as a witness. He was plaintiff, he brought this action, he alleged his great desire to compete in the Olympics and to represent his country and the United States in Mexico."

—However, on the issue as to his eligibility to compete, when confronted by an accusation in the forum which he had chosen he remained silent.


Not Quite Defenseless

Having established that point, this daughter of Iowa states this son of Chester Bowles out of the government by unfairly attempting to place the onus on his clubmate, with the possibility that the latter would be found guilty and the plaintiff escape the check of \$400, to his father-in-law from the promoter of a certain meet, and other matters, furnish any serious consideration of his plea that he was harshly or unfairly dealt with by his representatives, if any, and the court thinks there is no hope—comes too late.

—Plaintiff should have thought of the Olympics and his representative of his country before he engaged his booking agent, before he accepted payments in excess of the regulated amounts, before he tried to brand his clubmate as the professional and falsely place the halo of amateurism upon himself, before he consistently violated the rules of the organization in which he professes to continue his membership. When he took out his athletic membership in the A.A.U., he agreed to abide by the rules and regulations of the Union. He has not only failed to do so, but he makes no pretense of having done so.
