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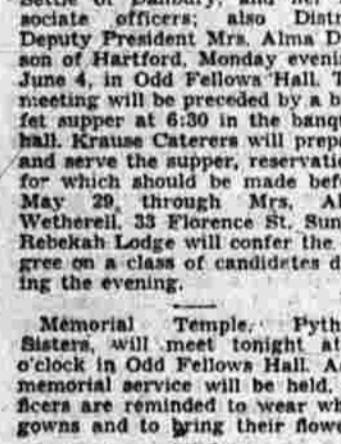

### Soviet Says Soup Cause of Cancer

London, May 23 (U)—A Soviet medical man agreed today with those Western researchers who believe smoking may lead to lung cancer.

The Russian added that cancer of the stomach may be caused by addition to hot soup.

A Moscow Radio broadcast carrying the views of the medical spokesman identified him as Prof. Larionov, an associate member of the U.S.S.R. Academy of Medical Sciences.

"It goes without saying," Larionov declared, "that by giving up smoking the chances of contracting cancer of the lung can be considerably reduced."

"As for cancer of the stomach, on the whole it is likely that the intake of excessively hot food plays an important role in causing this. Many people, for instance, love soup, the temperature of which is 60 to 70 degrees centigrade (140 to 154 degrees Fahrenheit), while the cells of our bodies can be damaged within a few minutes at a temperature of 45 degrees (113 degrees Fahrenheit)."

"Among the rural population in Russia, who consume mainly fruit and milk, there are practically no cases of malignant tumors of the stomach," Larionov added.

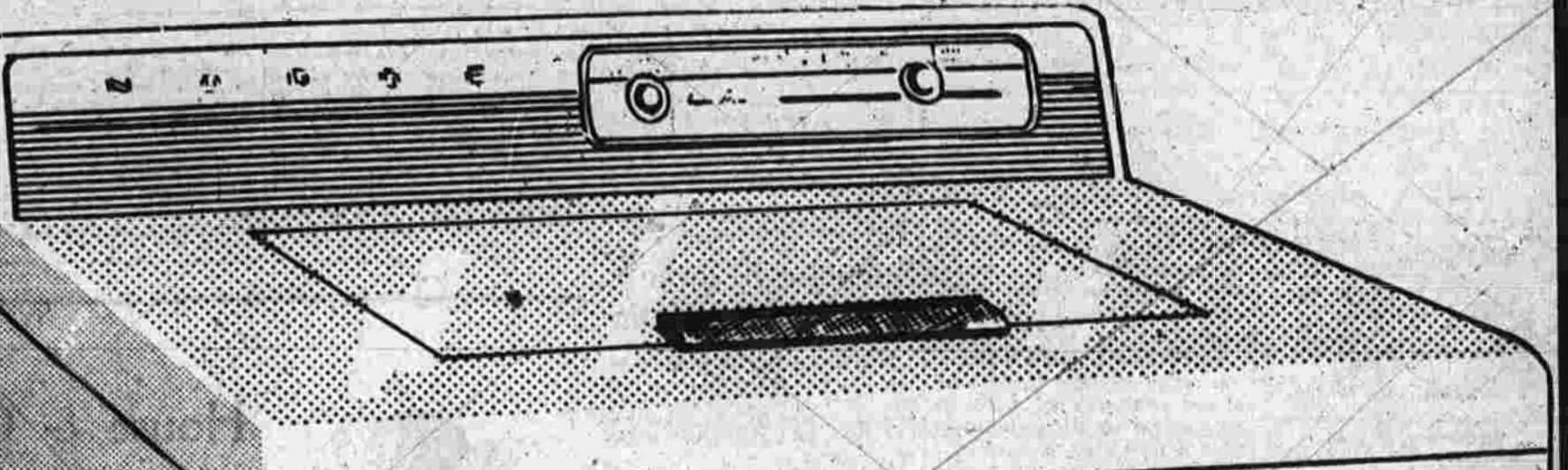

**Our Scientists Impressed**

On June 10 he said the New Soviet policy was the result of "a train" created by the West, that the Russians had really not understood any change of heart, and that their economy was on the point of collapse.

...with a light blue shirt and a square tie of darker blue. He dealt with these other matters:—

There — Asked about the prospect for a tax reduction in the light of new estimates that there will be a budget surplus of \$1,800,000,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, Eisenhower said there should be no such cut until a start has been made toward reducing the big national debt. There is such a thing as fiscal integrity, he added.

Egypt — Eisenhower said the United States thinks Egypt made a mistake in recognizing Red China. He hastened to add, however, that one such act by a nation does not and should not mean friendship. He said also that such action should not destroy our efforts to work with Egypt.

Foreign Policy — A spokesman asked Eisenhower for his appraisal of what the reporter termed "slippage" of the western world with relation to the Communist bloc in the foreign policy field. The President replied that such slippage is more likely to occur on the free world side than it is in the case of totalitarian governments.

But he added he believes too much pessimism is being spread regarding the state of the world today. Eisenhower said he did not mean everything is perfect — that — but that some progress is being made even though the way is slow and rocky.

Friendly to Both Sides — There are bound to be disappointments, he said, in the light of the kind of problems facing the free world. The United States, he said, is determined to be friendly to both sides.

Eisenhower said the entry of the United States into the economic field in competition with the West is a new development. Until the

the Senate Agriculture Committee called the provisions "fair." Sen. Aiken (R-Vt.), committee Republican, said:

"Although I do not believe the bill will be nearly as effective as some of its advocates hope, I do believe it is the best that can be secured at this session of Congress."

The biggest administration victory in the compromise bill was a softening of House provisions for price supports on the feed grains — corn, soybeans and sorghum. The compromise calls for price supports at no less than 78 per cent of parity for these grains, without any planting or marketing restrictions. Parity is a legal standard said to be fair to farmers in relation to their costs.

**10% Support on Grain**  
Next year grain growers would get at least 78 per cent support, and these could be higher if a comparable higher support is allowed for corn grown outside acreage allotments.

The feed grain agreement would eliminate another feature of the House bill that was objectionable to the administration — tying feed grains to commercial corn for support purposes and fixing the support level 5 percentage points below that for commercial corn. Under such a method, feed grains would have been supported this year at 81 1/2 per cent of parity for farmers who cut their acreage 10 per cent.
