**Dresden Art Heads Home**

Berlin, May 24 (AP)—The Dresden art collection is on its way home. The paintings are being shipped from East Berlin to the state art museum in Dresden. An exhibition there on June 4 will coincide with the city's 750th anniversary observance.

The collection includes works of Titicotto, Vermeer, Rubens and other masters. Raphael's "St. Martin" is the best known. The paintings were removed from the Dresden gallery in the early days of World War II and hidden in an underground shelter. This precaution saved them. The gallery was bombed out and today is still only partially restored.

In 1945 the Russians seized the paintings and shipped them by truck to Moscow. Last year the Russians put them on public display at Moscow's Pushkin Museum, then turned them over to the East Germans.

The paintings were on exhibit in East Berlin until the end of April. Nearly 300,000 visitors viewed them.

Certain of the 530 pictures will be kept in East Berlin for restoration work. Because of this and the fact that the rebuilding of the Dresden gallery is still unfinished, it is expected that only 200 paintings will be on display there June 4.

**Delegates Slate Cut if One Quits**

Hartford, May 24 (AP)—The Connecticut Attorney General ruled yesterday that under the new State primary law, if a member of an opposition slate to a congressional withdrawal, the whole slate is knocked out.

The ruling was made on request by Secretary of State Mildred Allen, on an inquiry by State Republican Chairman Clarence Bawden.

The state law says that organization slates can have substitutes, but not challenging slates.

So Bawden wondered what happened if a member of an opposition slate withdrew, or died, or moved out of state, or withdrew for any other reason before the primary. Attorney Gen. John J. Bracken ruled that the entire opposition slate is thus disqualified, and the primary automatically canceled.

### Brazilian Bill Seeks to Lift Divorce Ban

 A bill to be introduced in the Chamber of Deputies would allow divorce after five years of legal separation. Divorce never has been legal in Brazil.

The bill will change the civil code so as to circumvent the constitutional clause saying "marriage is indissoluble."

At present a couple can obtain a legal separation, but neither can marry again. The separated wife no longer can use her husband's name and is not entitled to inheritance or any other wife's benefits.

The legal separation is termed "separação."

Common Law Union Remains  
 Since remarriage is impossible, these separated persons often take on a companion who in fact is a spouse. This companion, under the law, is entitled to all the benefits of a married person but not the title. A child is legitimate if the father recognizes the offspring as his own.

A region of such cases includes diplomatic corps, engineers, journalists and congressmen. There are 2,000 to 3,000 new "dequidados" a year.

Under the bill to be introduced by Magalhães de Almeida, couples applying for divorce after five years legal separation, will be allowed to remarry.

Magalhães said the law must protect and regulate these facts of life. He said that the law looks with favor on the situation facing Brazilian society.

The Roman Catholic Church opposes any change in the law. There are only two ways to legalize divorce in Brazil. Amend the constitution or change the civil code to circumvent the constitutional clause. The latter project, when introduced, will face a tough path.

### Tests Refute Fallout-Peril For Canada

Deep River, Ont., May 24 (AP)—Experiments with milk have given Canadian scientists assurance that fallout from atomic tests in the United States is not a health hazard to the north.

Tests conducted here show that the radioactivity of milk has increased minutely since the United States and Russia began exploding atomic bombs.

Monthly experiments with milk help determine the present level of atomic radiation throughout Canada. This level is made up of natural radiation background that is contained in soil and rock formations and caused by cosmic rays from space streaming down on the earth.

Man-made radioactivity, from atomic tests, is added to the natural radiation. The man-made radioactivity will be the yardstick scientists will use to determine any increase in radiation levels.

When an atomic bomb explodes, radioactive fission products are thrown off. Some of these products settle in the immediate area of the explosion, while part of them rise high into the atmosphere and are eventually blown to distant areas.

One of these fission products is strontium 90.

### The Doctor Says

**Doctors Still Debating the Value of Liqueur Given in Heart Cases**

EDWIN T. JORDAN, M. D., Written for NEA Service

I certainly hope that the practice mentioned in today's first letter is not common.

Q.—What do you think of the statement that doctors are making to men lately that liquor is good for the heart? May the link be true but I understand it is not good for the heart. I personally believe it is making alcoholics out of men.—Reader

A.—I do not think any doctor would intentionally make an alcoholic out of a patient regardless of the reason. There are some doctors who feel that a small amount of alcoholic beverage is relaxing and therefore helpful to a tense person with some forms of heart difficulty. On the other hand, there are studies in the medical literature which report that alcohol is of no benefit for any form of heart disease. If used at all, it certainly should be increased to the point where the patient becomes an alcoholic.

Q.—You said in one of your columns that it is usually not advisable for a person to give blood more than every few weeks. When my daughter was ill with fatal blood poisoning, I gave 13 transfusions in 12 days, including two on the last day. Later, I gave blood on the average of once a week for some time. Now at 70 I am not permitted to give blood.

A.—This sounds like an extraordinary amount of blood to give and I shall have to hold to my original statement that usually a person cannot safely give blood too often.

Q.—I had some clothes given to me by a woman who passed away with cancer and I have been told that by wearing her clothes I could catch it. Is this right?—Mrs. C. E.

A.—This is not right. Cancer is not catching or contagious.

Q.—I have small scars on my face due to acne. I have read that a dermatologist can remove them. Will you kindly explain.—E. C.

A.—You have probably heard about the wire brush or possibly sandpaper methods which have been used in some instances to remove small scars from the skin. It cannot be effective for all but there would certainly be no harm in consulting a skin specialist to find out whether it would be useful to you.

Q.—What happens when a woman has all her female organs removed? Does this have an effect on sex? A mgr. said that he would leave his wife alone should have to have this operation.—Mr. J.

A.—The operation referred to is probably an hysterectomy involving the removal of the womb and sometimes the tubes and ovaries. In most instances it would not affect the sex life unfavorably. I cannot understand the reactions of a man who would make such a remark if his wife's health was at stake.

Q.—Can you say something about spontaneous pneumothorax?—R. S.

A.—This is a condition in which one lung suddenly collapses usually without apparent reason. In some it is considered related to tuberculosis. Though one can get along quite well with one lung, spontaneous pneumothorax requires treatment and general rest. After a time the lung usually expands and resumes normal functioning.

Q.—I should like to know what causes a tubal pregnancy.—Mrs. A. P.

### Doctors Still Debating the Value of Liqueur Given in Heart Cases

EDWIN T. JORDAN, M. D., Written for NEA Service

I certainly hope that the practice mentioned in today's first letter is not common.

Q.—What do you think of the statement that doctors are making to men lately that liquor is good for the heart? May the link be true but I understand it is not good for the heart. I personally believe it is making alcoholics out of men.—Reader

A.—I do not think any doctor would intentionally make an alcoholic out of a patient regardless of the reason. There are some doctors who feel that a small amount of alcoholic beverage is relaxing and therefore helpful to a tense person with some forms of heart difficulty. On the other hand, there are studies in the medical literature which report that alcohol is of no benefit for any form of heart disease. If used at all, it certainly should be increased to the point where the patient becomes an alcoholic.

Q.—You said in one of your columns that it is usually not advisable for a person to give blood more than every few weeks. When my daughter was ill with fatal blood poisoning, I gave 13 transfusions in 12 days, including two on the last day. Later, I gave blood on the average of once a week for some time. Now at 70 I am not permitted to give blood.

A.—This sounds like an extraordinary amount of blood to give and I shall have to hold to my original statement that usually a person cannot safely give blood too often.

Q.—I had some clothes given to me by a woman who passed away with cancer and I have been told that by wearing her clothes I could catch it. Is this right?—Mrs. C. E.

A.—This is not right. Cancer is not catching or contagious.

Q.—I have small scars on my face due to acne. I have read that a dermatologist can remove them. Will you kindly explain.—E. C.

A.—You have probably heard about the wire brush or possibly sandpaper methods which have been used in some instances to remove small scars from the skin. It cannot be effective for all but there would certainly be no harm in consulting a skin specialist to find out whether it would be useful to you.

Q.—What happens when a woman has all her female organs removed? Does this have an effect on sex? A mgr. said that he would leave his wife alone should have to have this operation.—Mr. J.

A.—The operation referred to is probably an hysterectomy involving the removal of the womb and sometimes the tubes and ovaries. In most instances it would not affect the sex life unfavorably. I cannot understand the reactions of a man who would make such a remark if his wife's health was at stake.

Q.—Can you say something about spontaneous pneumothorax?—R. S.

A.—This is a condition in which one lung suddenly collapses usually without apparent reason. In some it is considered related to tuberculosis. Though one can get along quite well with one lung, spontaneous pneumothorax requires treatment and general rest. After a time the lung usually expands and resumes normal functioning.

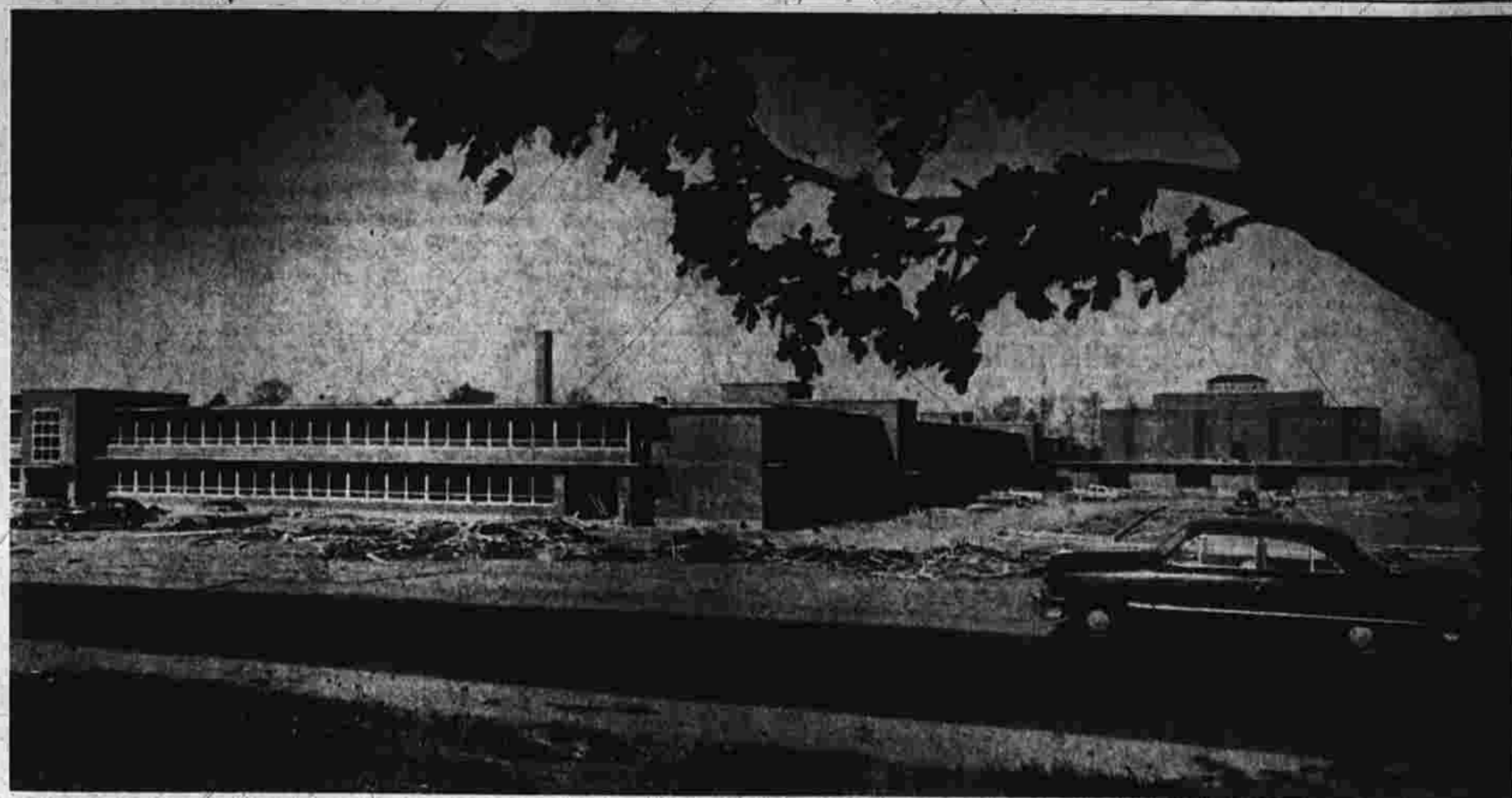

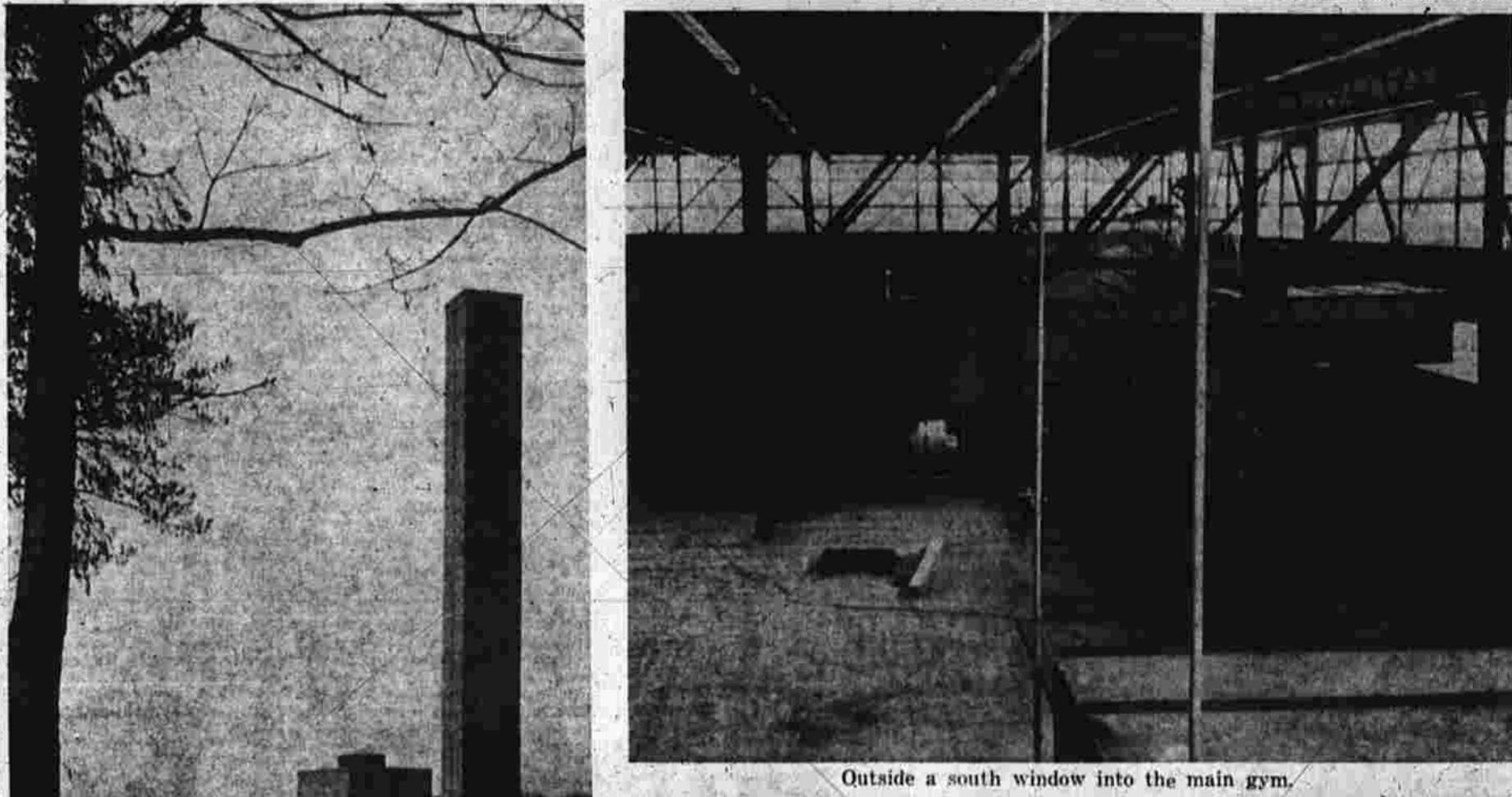

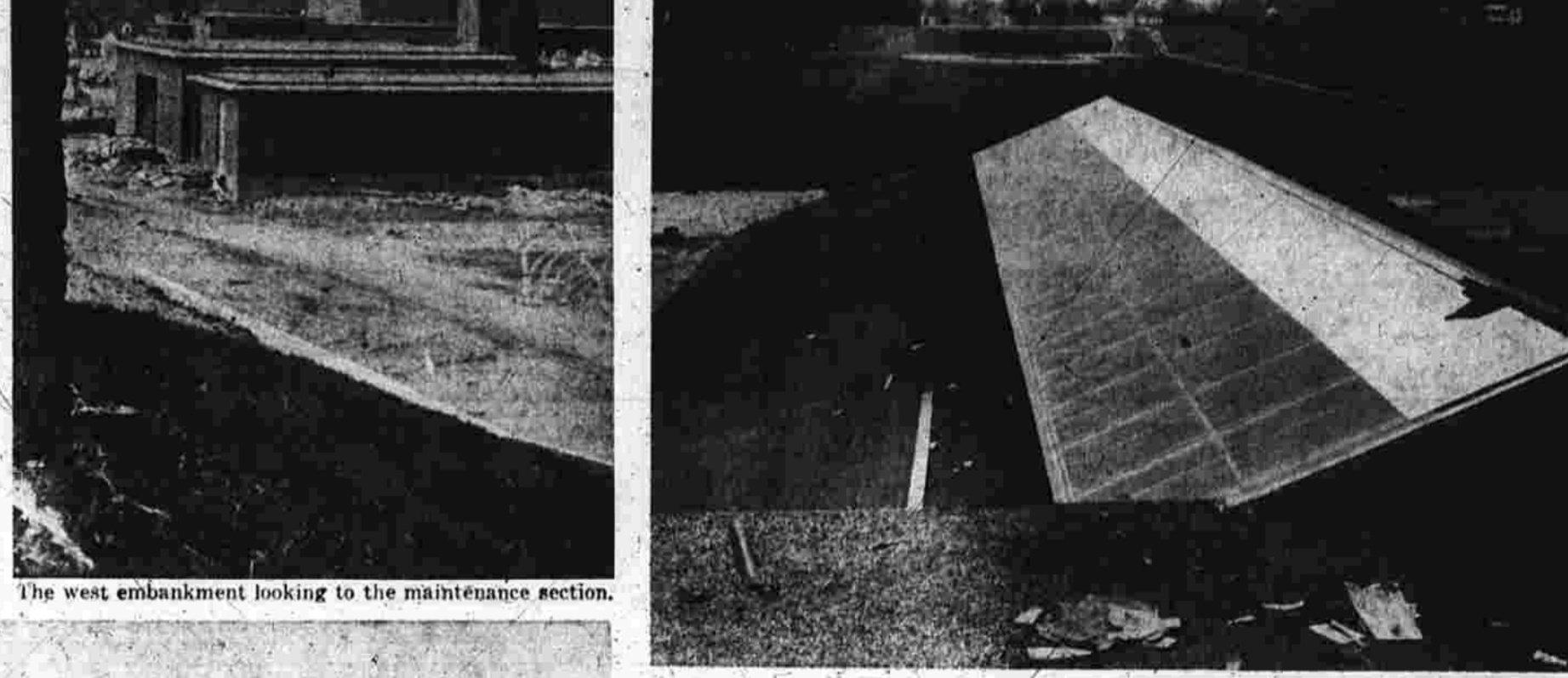
The roof over the shops looking at the quadrangle side of the administrative wing.

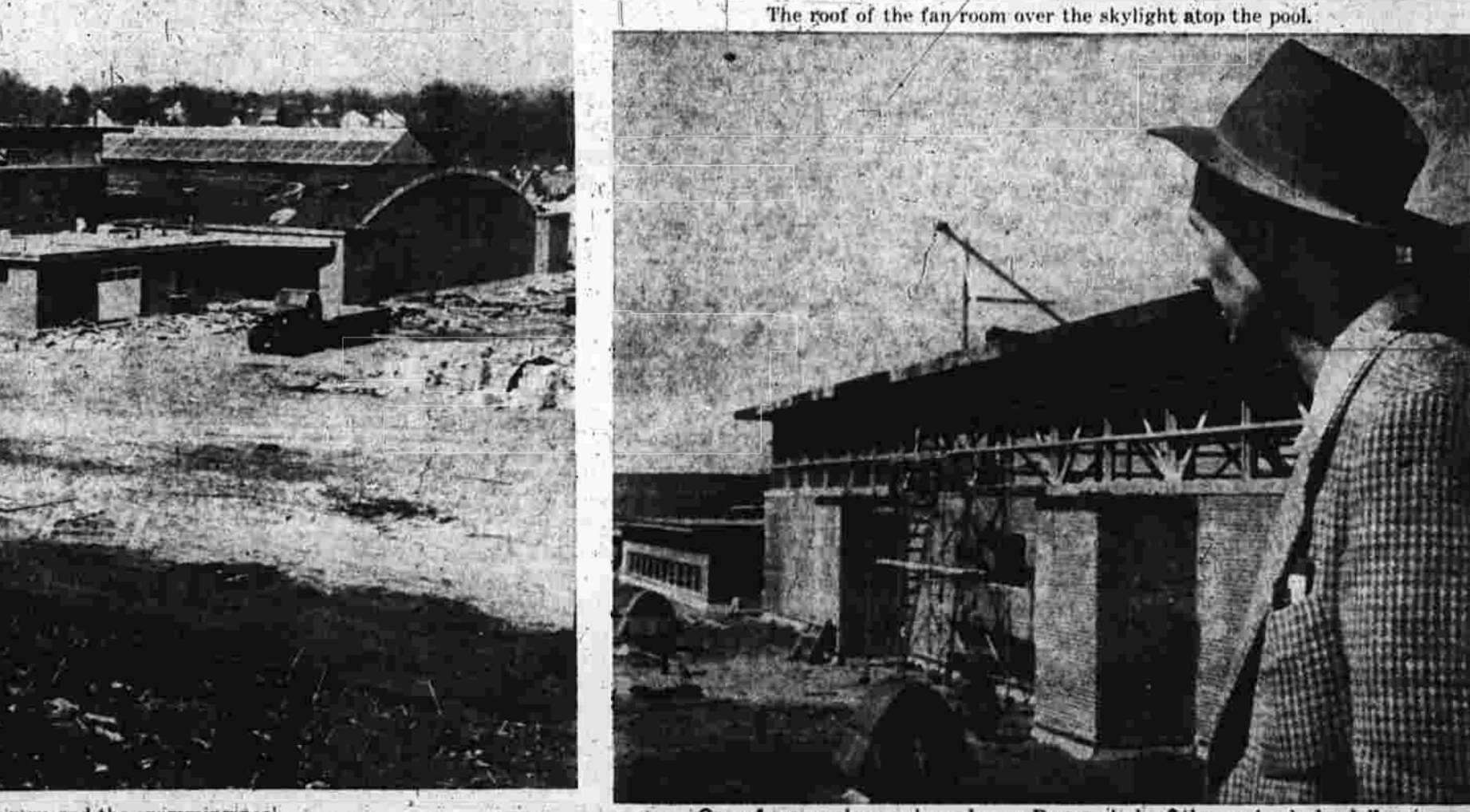
