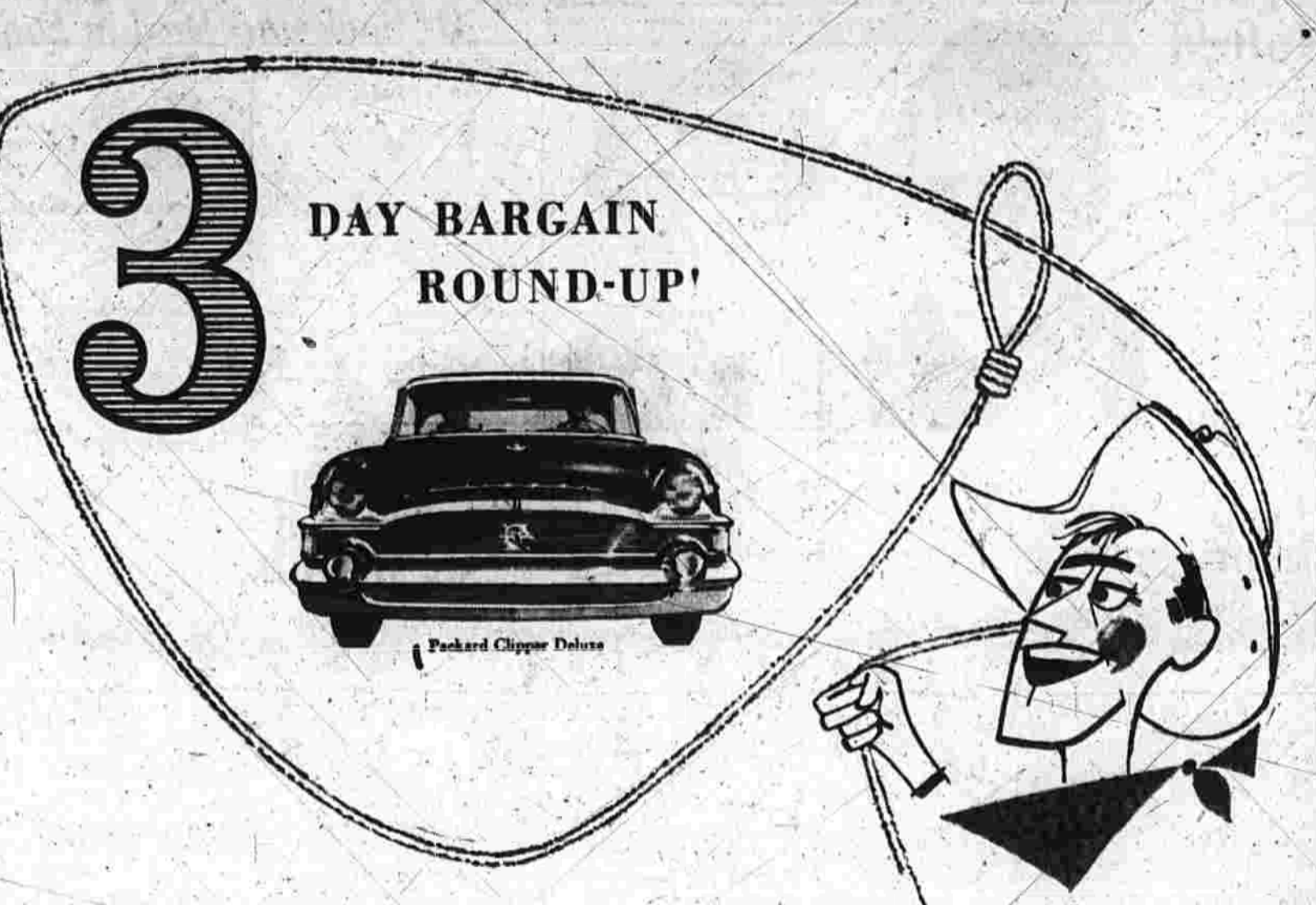

Noisy New Weapons Peril Hearing of U.S. Servicemen

Washington (NEA)—They may have learned World War II lessons, but they are not too sure today. That's the ironical contention of a battery of expert testimony before the House subcommittee on the hearing of the deafening noise of rocket engines being tested for guided missiles.

A few weeks ago the Veterans Administration had to create a new category of disability payments for "former" servicemen whose hearing had been damaged by too much exposure to rocket and jet noise.

An undisclosed number of men have been forced out of service because of the ailment.

Drives Up to \$181 Monthly "Loss of hearing discrimination" is the VA's technical term for their trouble. They can hear sound when someone talks. But they can't distinguish words.

Up to \$181 per month will be paid to these men.

The services provide ear plugs for men working near rockets and jets. But the men forget to wear them. And medical science has not learned exactly what the physical effects are of these manmade noises of unprecedented intensity.

Jet noises have already affected aircraft design. For instance, it was learned that the noise from the engines on the new B-52 bomber shredded the wing flaps. The flaps had to be redesigned to stand this unique strain.

The community noise levels are jet clutter is old. But the current need to establish more than a dozen rocket engine test sites around the country because of the missile speed-up program brings up a new situation.

No Danger to Citizens "There is no danger of ear damage to citizens in towns near a rocket firing. But it is a nuisance with a risk of broken windows and cracked plaster," says the VA.

The gravity of community relations problem is revealed at the North American A-119 rocket test center hidden in the remote Santa Susana Mountains, 35 miles northwest of Los Angeles. Tests are static firings. No rockets are launched.

People in the area complaining of the frequent "startles" have protested so earnestly that serious consideration has been given to closing the test center, expensive installation and moving it to some remote spot.

However, transportation difficulties make it impossible to put all rocket test centers far from civilization.

NEW Conducts Rush Study A rush study of rocket noise now being made by Massachusetts Institute of Technology, in seeking new information for properly locating test sites. It has been learned that large areas of sand tend to absorb the noise, while stone, rock and concrete tend to bounce them.

Weather conditions also have a lot to do with the propagation of rocket noises.

The Doctor Says

Cause of Hives, Treatment Are Mystery for Doctors

By EDWIN F. JORDAN, M. D. Written for NEA Service

Each year a considerable number of correspondents ask for a discussion about the strange condition known as hives or urticaria. This is generally considered to be a form of allergy though it is certainly not related to the seasons as is hay fever, another well known allergic disorder.

The cause of hives usually comes out of the blue, appearing on the skin with intense itching and redness. The itching generally appears almost as fast as it comes and sometimes lasts only a few hours. One of my children had an attack of this sort and I never did know what caused it.

In many respects hives, or urticaria, is still a mysterious condition. The completely unexpected appearance of hives in a person who has never had them before is one of the many problems about this condition which has yet to be solved.
