Rockville, May 31 (Special) A vociferous 9-month struggle be-tween Vernon's Board of Finance

and the forces of education ended on an ironically quiet note at a special Town Meeting Tuesday evening as about 50 voters approved a \$685,820 budget for cur-rent education expenses.

The budget topic of much heatof discussion since October, has been the cause of a long succession of unusual events. Since the financial struggle began, three Town Meetings, a public hearing, and a referendum have been held, the Board of Finance resigned, a Citizen's Committee for Edication was formed and a new Finance. was formed and a new Finance Board appointed. Board appointed.

Through all the controversy the Board of Education has operated without a budget, knowing that at any time the Town Treasurer could refuse to sign checks for school bills.

The series of events began at the annual Town Meeting last October when it became official that the Board of Finance had slashed the education request by

slashed the education request by some \$26,000. At that meeting retiring Board of Education Chairman John Gottier protested the cut vigorously, unaware that less than a year later he would be chairman of the Board of Finance which would pass this same budget request he had helped to prepare. The dispute was climaxed last month with the mass resignation of the Finance Board, which had refused to reconsider the cuts each time it had been asked by the townspeople. A new Board was appointed retaining the same 6-member non-partisan features of the former one. the former one.
