Police Hold Man In Wife's Death

Voluntown, June 1 (Special) - A coroner's warrant has been issued for the detention of Paul Surina in connection with the death of his 64-year-old wife, Helma, at their home here early Thursday.

Adlai Stevenson's position increase bill which he called "untenable, irresponsible and demagogic."

Stevenson, who has been more than once a political prisoner, said that the bill was "a calculated move to provide any new tax revenues to pay the \$14 million increase in the Federal Reserve's increased personnel would have cost."

Stevenson advocated retirement benefits for persons 50 years of age or older who become totally and permanently disabled. He urged, too, the lowering of the retirement age for women from 65 to 62.

Both in San Diego and earlier in Los Angeles, Stevenson assailed foreign and defense policies of the Eisenhower administration.

The presidential contest noted was described as a growing tide of isolation within the Republican party which he linked directly to California's Republican Sen. William F. Knutson.

Blame for the alleged failure to cope with new Russian world tactics, Stevenson predicted the voters would turn again to the liberal leadership of the Democratic party in November, because "that have had enough of Republican complacency."

"We have had enough of government by drift and slogan, of government that averts every hard problem under the rug and announces that everything is really good," Stevenson said.

Stevenson said the administration moved to balance its 1956-57 budget by slicing \$1.5 billion in Air Force funds. He commented, "I don't believe in balancing the budget by reducing our life insurance."

"Almost daily the Secretary of State or the President himself issues reassuring bulletins that we are strong, that we are respected, that we have the initiative and that we have the Communists on the run," he said.

"But almost every day we read reports from here and abroad telling us a very different story. The better fact is that Russia's economy is now expanding faster than ours, so that soon its industrial output will be equal to our own."

Stevenson campaigns today in Anaheim, Newark and other areas fringing Los Angeles, then returns into the central valley Saturday in his final swing through Northern California.

"In the context of Supreme Court decisions under a Chief Justice appointed by President Eisenhower, decisions as historic as the emancipation proclamation of Lincoln, and it is my opinion that it has not yet been told sufficiently well to the average Negro voter."

"Nixon stirred a controversy with a somewhat similar statement in a New York speech Feb. 13 when in listing the Eisenhower administration's actions against segregation, he said:

"And, speaking for a unanimous Supreme Court, a great Republican Chief Justice, Earl Warren, has ordered an end to racial segregation in the nation's public schools."

Some Democrats accused the Vice President of seeking to drag the Supreme Court into party politics. Eisenhower, though he voiced no criticism of Nixon, said he himself regarded the past political affiliation of High Court judges as meaningless.

Tobin said also that if only 5 or 10 per cent of Negro voters could be persuaded to switch their votes from the Democrats to the Republican ticket Eisenhower might be elected under any present circumstances.

Hit UN Team Endorses U.S. Position

South Korea's Pyongyang Radio claimed today the U.N. command cannot suspend Korean truce and inspection activities in South Korea and warned: "Your side will be solely responsible for all the consequences arising therefrom."

The first broadcast from the North Korean capital on the U.N. command's decision to suspend truce and inspection activities was monitored in Tokyo. It was mainly an account of the reply North Korean Col. Lo in H made to the allies after their Thursday announcement at Panmunjom.

The U.N. command suspended the Communists' decision to suspend inspection machinery as a blindfold for an inspection in North Korea with the compliance of Chechoslovakia and Polish members of the Neutral Truce Supervisory Commission. The allies said inspection teams, which also include Sweden and Swiss, would be flown out of South Korea in about a week.

The CTU is seeking an hourly wage increase of 15 cents for all employees, whose wages now average \$1.86 an hour. It has demanded other job classification and fringe benefits averaging 12 cents an hour.

Tolland County Superior Court

Rockville, June 1 (Special)—A Coventry zoning regulation appeal filed in Tolland County Court of Common Pleas by Lynn Beerwort, was upheld by Judge Alex P. Gosciniak in a memorandum decision filed with County Clerk John H. Yeomans.

Beerwort, who operates a trailer camp in Coventry, has been fighting a zoning battle with the town for nearly five years. The case developed when the Coventry zoning enforcement officer told Beerwort he must desist from operating his trailer camp during the winter months, informing him that such use was an extension of a non-conforming business in a residential zone.

On Oct. 2, 1951, the Zoning Board of Appeals upheld the zoning officer. At that time Beerwort announced he would fight the case.

In the case it was noted by the defense that Beerwort had previously operated his trailer camp on a seasonal basis, running from about Memorial Day to shortly after Labor Day.

The plaintiff emphasized the number of improvements made to the property prior to zoning, with the expectation that two or three trailers would be on the entire year at the trailer park.

Judge Gosciniak, in his decision which cited a number of other State cases, noted that in view of the cases and the action in this particular case the court "can only come to the conclusion that the zoning regulations of Coventry allow the extension of a non-conforming use so long as it is not contrary to the subsections of the zoning ordinance."
