A check with the FBI showed it to be Brinka's money. The Baltimore FBI said Perry was hooked on a conditional release violation warrant, issued by the U.S. Board of Parole.

Stevenson closed his campaign with a television talk in which he said his record as governor of Illinois had been "deliberately distorted" during the campaign. He bitterly primary fight. He said his records speak louder than the words of Kefauver.

In Springfield, Ill., yesterday, the State Democratic caucus chose 28 half-vote national convention delegates, but took no action to place them in a specific order. Fifty full-vote delegates were chosen in an April Primary.

Members of Stevenson's campaign in a keynote speech brought cheers and applause. There is some conservative opposition to the former governor.

Rhode Island Democrats last night picked a 16-vote delegation to the convention. Though unpledged, most were expected to go to Stevenson.

The two Wisconsin Republican Senators, Wiley and McCarthy, tangled in an argument on the Senate floor yesterday over Wiley's charges that "king makers" and "Eisenhower hangers" in Wisconsin engineered his rebuff by a GOP state convention last month.

The convention endorsed Rep. Glenn Davis of Wisconsin for Wiley's seat in a Sept. 11 primary race. Wiley said Davis was persuaded to run after being promised a \$50,000 "jackpot" for the campaign.

McCarthy called this an insult to Davis and told why "king makers and Republicans" had repudiated him after denouncing Wiley was "not a good Senator."

In Washington, delegates to a Young Republican National school quizzed White House aide Max Baucus on the 1952 campaign. Baucus declined to talk to newsmen about his closed session speech, but delegates said he pointed out that Negroes hold the balance of power in some 60 northern Congressional districts.

They said Baucus listed what he considered outstanding accomplishments of the Eisenhower administration in race relations, then said that while some Democrats have done nothing.

In Beverly Hills, Calif., Murray M. Chotiner said a Senate investigating his affairs adds up to a political "fishing expedition" by Democrats.

Chotiner, who managed Vice President Nixon's 1952 campaign, was questioned about his activities in behalf of individuals figuring in a probe of alleged graft in military clothing contracts.

A GOP National Chairman Leonard Hall said Saturday Chotiner would not be used in the 1956 campaign.
