### Linda's Lending Library

Books (Special)—While older residents study the possibility of building a new public library in town, a young girl, Linda Hassett, of Birch Mountain Rd. has established a private operation known to the delight of some six neighborhood children.

The children range in age from six to nine years, and according to the librarian, have exercised great care in handling the books and returning them on time.

### Research Rocket Fizzes Out Again

White Sands Proving Ground, N. M., June 4 (UP)—The Navy got another fizzle Monday when it attempted to shoot a research rocket up 128 miles.

Its Aerobee-HI reached only 37 miles into the sky. It attained not quite half the 4,000-foot-second velocity hoped for.

John Townsend and other scientists working on the project indicated it might be abandoned or at least delayed for a long time until they can find out what the trouble is.

Townsend and fellow technicians obviously were disappointed yesterday when they went out to examine the failed rocket, 14 miles from the blockhouse at the firing site.

"Developing missiles on a shooting budget is not an easy task," Townsend said.

Do's offense, his attitude and that of his family, and his general physical and financial condition. If the investigators find it necessary, they will use X-ray, social and psychiatric examinations.

They will follow Doe down through the years via the papers, work, route—military records, FBI and police records, school records, records from other jobs, records to Doe in newspapers, records he might have from institutions.

This policy may lead into other states, through varied environments, and through associations with many people.

Do's competencies, failings, and the influence upon him will appear like signposts along the way, usually pointing like an exercise in logic to the commission of the crime for which he awaits sentence.

This research constitutes the "pre-sentence investigation," the compiling of sociological and psychological report on John Doe. Copies of the completed report are sent to the court, prosecutor, and defense attorney.

## Hartford Man Loses Appeal

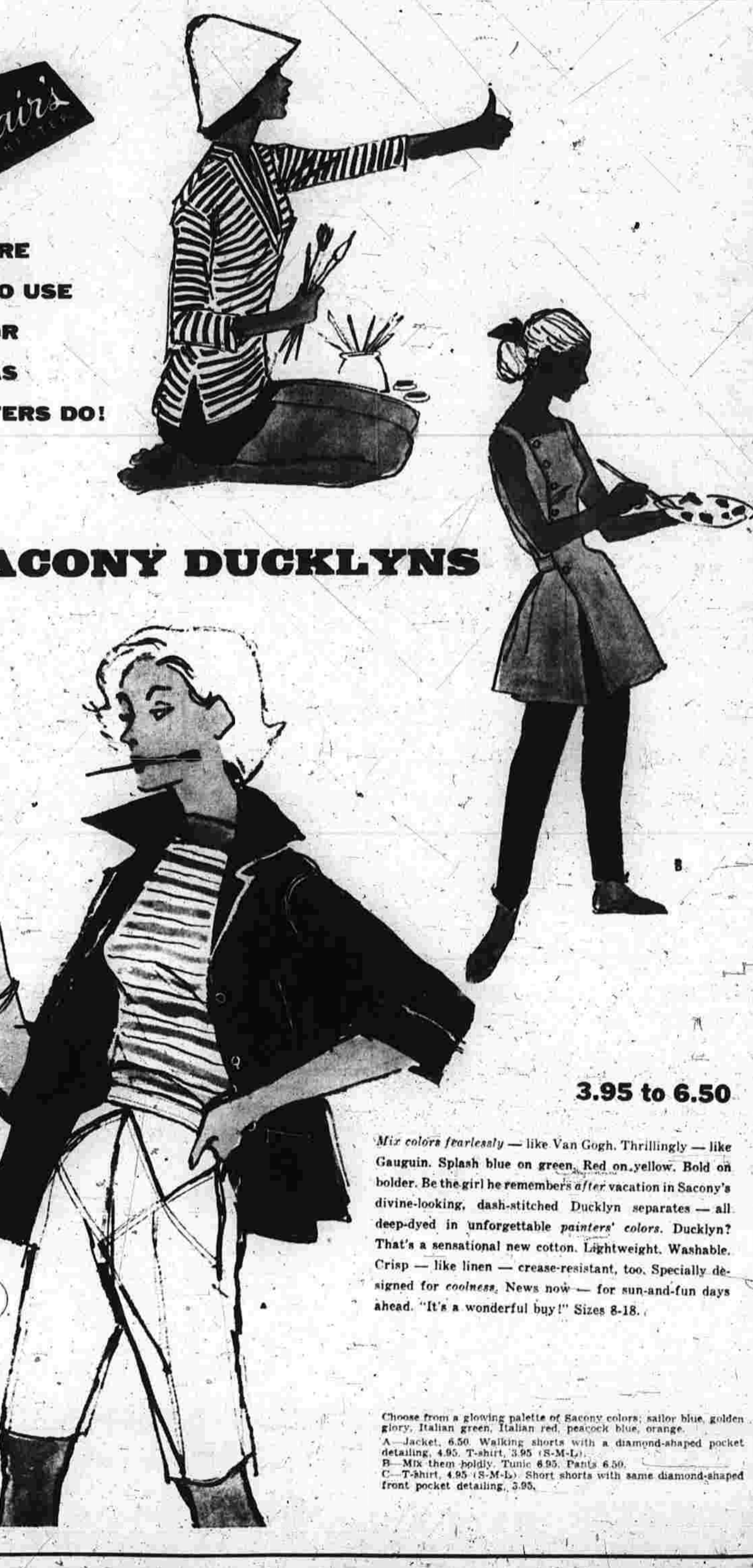

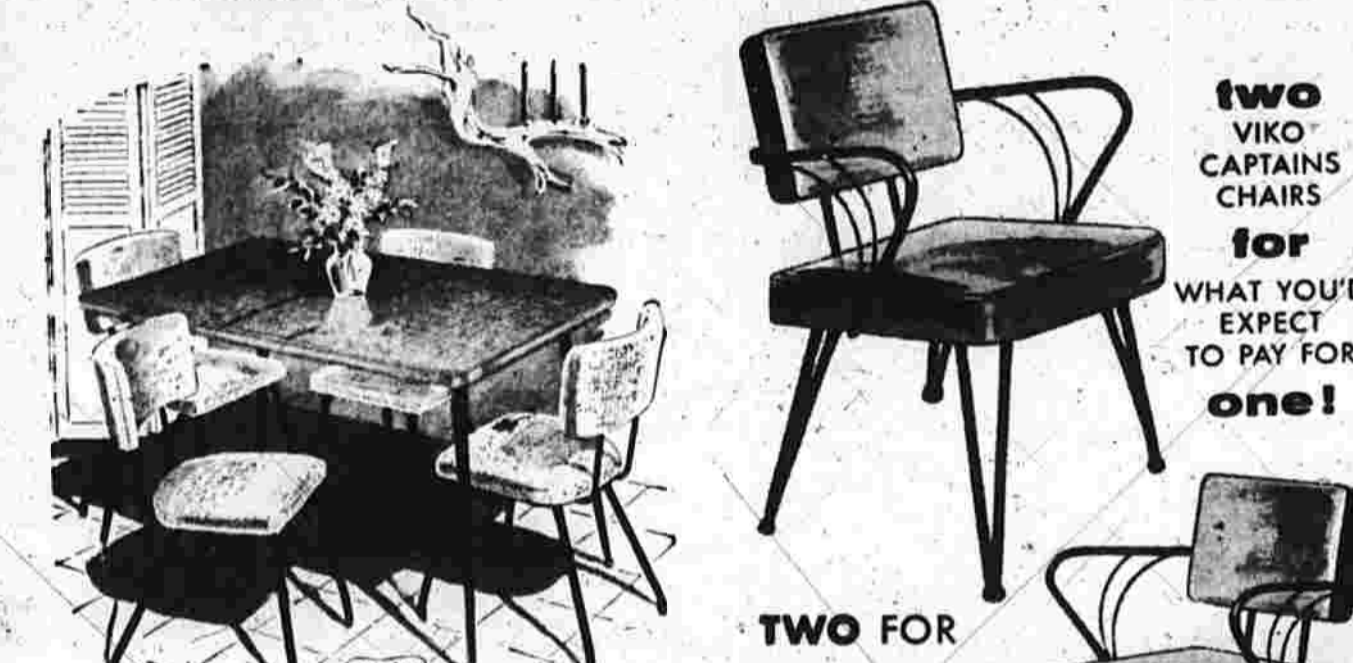

### Regional School Plans Draw Opposition in Marlborough

Marlborough, June 6 (Special) — Plans for a new 800-student regional high school were met with opposition in Marlborough today. Two members of the Board of Education last night in the first of three forums held to acquaint the townpeople of the proposed plan, and the Marlborough Board of Education with the referendum they will vote on Friday.

Addressing the Regional District No. 8 Board, Don Russell, Marlborough board member, said the new school would cause a rate of 2.5 mills in his town's present tax rate of 37 mills.

Suggesting smaller schools, Russell's fellow board member, Clifford Martineau, suggested that a school with a smaller central plant and student body might be designed and junior high schools could be erected in each of the three towns of the district whenever enrollment indicated it was needed.

(Answering Russell), Clifton R. Home, of Andover, pointed out that Marlborough's higher mill rate will be lowered when that town's property is included in the grand list correspondingly.

Increasingly, Home said, the Douglas Fellows of Marlborough said earlier that it was not the school district alone that was expected to build the facilities, but that they would be necessary to meet the needs of the district.

Indicated that it would be less expensive to build a larger plant than to face the necessity of building again in each town in a short period of years.

Marlborough is presently planning to build a four-room unit in addition to a similar structure recently completed to accommodate their elementary school pupils.

Money Seen Big Problem

"The big problem," Home said, "is the money. Costs could be cut by dropping out of the program and delaying certain areas, such as the auditorium or home economics center."

He pointed out that these costs would cost more in the long run when it becomes necessary to do these things at a later date, because of the redesigning that would be immediately required and the steadily increasing building costs.

Louis Drake, West Hartford superintendent, had pointed out that the Board was hoping to be able to put the regional school out for bids before the next round in building cost hikes goes into effect. If the referendum is passed by the three towns, the Board expects to let bids around June 30.

Fellows, author of the brochure mailed to townpeople in the district Saturday, said the pamphlet attempted to "combine the thoughts and considerations of the Board in its whole year of operation."

In describing the type of school and curriculum chosen by the Board, Fellows said, "The youngsters of today have a different kind of world and a different kind of opportunity. This school provides an opportunity to give children their chance in the world."

Need of Science Training

He continued, "Today's world is so scientific that it is absolutely essential for every child to have an education."

"Concerning the cost of education, Fellows said, "There is no saving in anything if you deprive your children of the opportunity to develop. Industries are moving into this area because we have the technical 'know-how' and trained youth coming along."

## Archie Moore Sets Sights on Heavyweight Championship

### Stops Pompey In 10th Round In Title Scrap

London, June 6 (AP)—Archie Moore today brushed aside all questions about another defense of his light heavyweight title and said: "I'm the best heavyweight in the world—and that's the title I am after."

The cagey old fellow from San Diego, Calif., cleared his last hurdle on the way to the crown, vanquishing Rocky Marciano with a sixth round TKO at Yankee Stadium in a light heavyweight title fight in London's Harrington Arena last night.

"We had signed contracts for this fight in London as we had to go ahead with it," Moore said.

"Now I want the heavyweight title. I'm entitled to it. Marciano annihilated me as his light heavyweight opponent. Floyd Patterson and Tommy Jackson are fighting Friday. There's talk of a fight with Pompey in September. I can't get home soon enough to start it all out."

Patterson and Jackson hold marionettes for Moore who says he is 39, is reported to be 42, but who fights like a man of 20.

Charles Johnson, Moore's manager, said they planned to fight in the United States in a day or two.

"Moore will then take it easy and rest awhile," he said. "Archie is the obvious man for the heavyweight title. Maybe we'll fight the winner of the Jackson-Patterson fight in September. That seems to be the way things are shaping. We shall see on our return to the States."

Johnson added that Moore would not think of relinquishing his light-weight title until he has the heavyweight crown under his belt.

Another old professional of the business who was at ringside to see Moore cut Pompey to ribbons was American Manager Jack Kearns. Jack Dempsey's old pilot, Kearns, said the fight was going 15 rounds so he took his time and tagged Pompey as soon as he was ready.

Then came the ninth and Moore pounded Pompey with crushing rights and left hooks.

In the tenth, Moore went in for the kill.

He sent Pompey down for counts of eight, nine and eight before Referee Jack Hart stopped the slaughter.

Pompey went to his dressing room with a deep cut over his left eye and a big nose over both. Moore was unmarked.

Moore weighed 174, Pompey 171.
