A committee spokesman said the group voted overwhelmingly to send to the House an all-increase measure including these provisions:
1. The Legion plan to increase the present United States Veterans' pay from \$109 a month for World War I, II and Korean War veterans to \$115 a month and \$125 a month for those in the category of a pension bill backed by the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW), for a 20 per cent pension premium for veterans who served overseas.
2. A disabled American Veteran (DAV) backed proposal which would increase compensation to veterans for service-connected injury generally by 10 to 15 per cent. One hundred per cent service disabled veterans should have their compensation raised from \$181 to \$200 a month.
3. Pensions for Spanish War Veterans would be raised from \$64 and \$67 a month to \$75 a month.
4. A provision to raise the basic pension rates for widows of World War I, II and Korean War veterans from \$90.60 a month to \$95 a month, with corresponding increases for dependents.
5. A proposal, part of the principle in a pension bill backed by

Rockville Planners to Hold Fire Zone Airing
A public hearing has been called by Zoning Commissioners for June 19 in establishment of an industrial zone for the Vernon Fire District.
Proposed amendments to present zoning regulations add up to creating the zone, which will be the first location for industry in rural Vernon.
The area, which will contain about 300 acres, starts on Rt. 83 approximately 510 feet north of its intersection with Sunset Dr. runs north 2,700 feet, and then west along the south line of property owned by Wallace H. Thruall, to the east bank of the Middleam River.
It continues north along the river to Dart Hill Rd., then back along the South Windsor-Vernon town line.
Manufacturing or processing certain chemicals or goods is forbidden in the area, according to the proposed regulations, which also forbid location of residences there.
Zoning commissioners have said that property owners in the area, with whom they have discussed the proposal, have raised no objections about its becoming an industrial zone.
