Wednesday. It issued a new statement, de scribed as a clarification, which reiterated Eisenhower's arguments in favor of increased secur ments in favor of increased secur-ity through collective defense. It said such collective arrangements represent "the best and host ef-fective means of preserving world order within the framework of the United Nations."

The remarks this was designed to "clarify" were made by Elsenhower at his news conference Wednesday.
