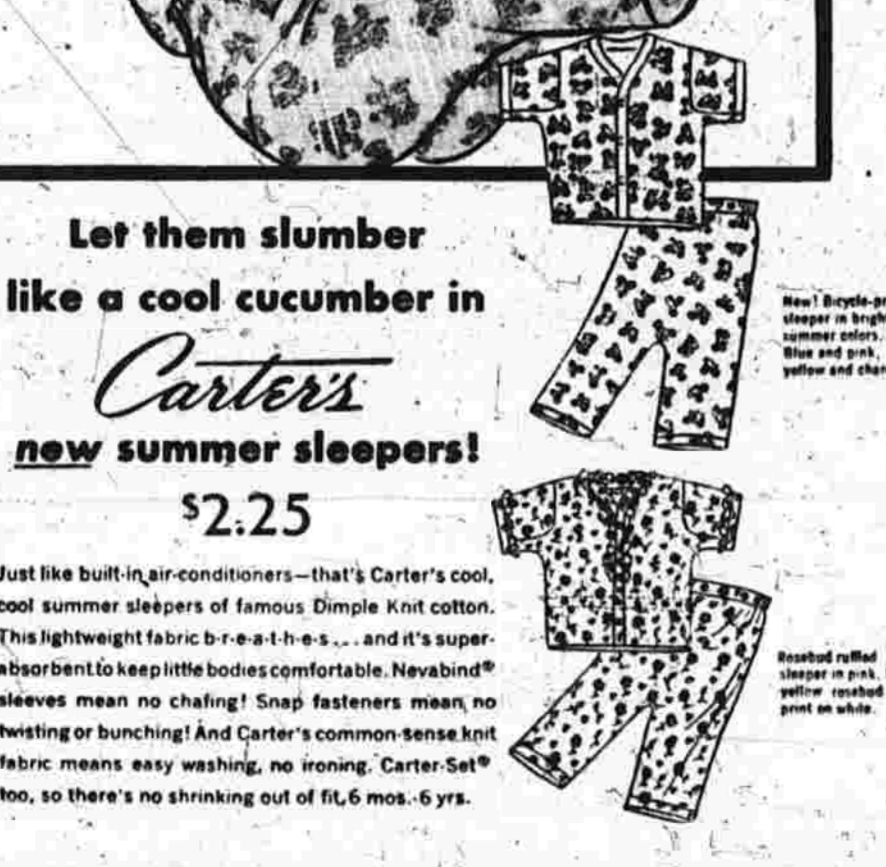

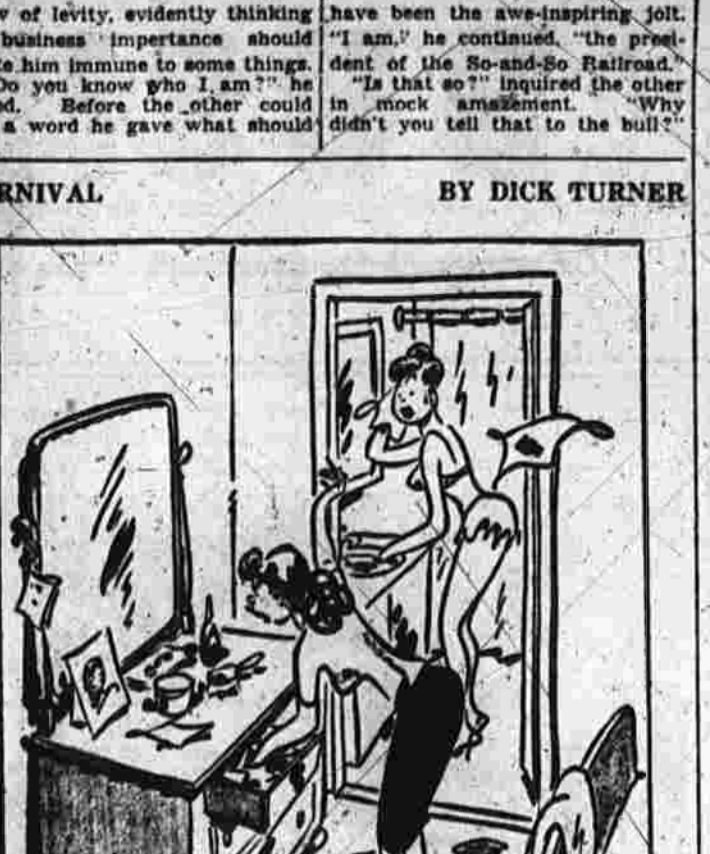

Ke Bypasses 'Big Question'

Washington, June 16 (AP)—Vice President Nixon conferred with President Eisenhower at Walter Reed Hospital today but reported there was absolutely no discussion of whether Eisenhower intends to remain in the presidential race. Nixon told a news conference after the visit that Eisenhower will speak for himself in answer to the big question when he feels the time is right. Asked whether there was any discussion whatever of politics at his meeting with the President, Nixon replied: "The answer is No. That is categorical without any qualification. Eisenhower himself, Nixon went on to say, was not in the 'place' for discussion of his political future. The vice president added that he has 'great confidence' in Eisenhower's ability to handle the situation. A reporter told Nixon there have been some suggestions that the vice president should resign his office, but Nixon said he had no such thoughts. He said he believes that until the President announces any change in his plans, "the rest of us" should not discuss the situation. Secretary of State Dulles also attended Eisenhower. The Vice President said Eisenhower first, spending about 15 minutes with him. They were joined by Dulles for about five minutes for a discussion of certain government problems. Nixon said he could not recall the nature of that discussion at this time, but that it had no relation to politics. After the joint conference, Dulles was alone with Eisenhower for about 10 minutes on what Nixon described as "State Department matters." The President's doctor issued a morning medical bulletin before he received Nixon and Dulles. This said he now weighs 162 pounds, seven points less than when he was admitted to the hospital June 8 for emergency abdominal surgery. Good Night's Rest The bulletin also said he had a "good night's rest" with almost 7 1/2 hours of continuous sleep. The President also had a "restful" night, and "in good spirits."

Adenauer Sees End Of Divided Germany

Bonn, Germany, June 16 (AP)—Chancellor Konrad Adenauer announced today his government plans a direct approach to the Soviet Union and the western Big Three powers on German unity. Adenauer said the German Foreign Office is now preparing a note on the unity question. The note, he said, will be sent to the Soviet American, British and French governments, but declined to say when. He added that the timing of the German note probably will be discussed with the Western powers in preparing their reply to Soviet Premier Bulganin's recent disarmament proposals. Adenauer made his announcement in a crowded news conference at which he reported his own "four-point" plan for German unity. He said the German note would contain no proposals to break the East-West deadlock on unity, but would be a "European attitude" as a news conference which would include such proposals. "An all-German government would be a necessary condition to establish diplomatic, consular and trade relations with the states of Eastern Europe in order to normalize conditions with these people," Adenauer said. "West Germany has taken the position that it will have no diplomatic relations with countries that recognize the legal existence of the Communist East German government. Bonn has not been able to adjourn to support highway construction in the countries of eastern Europe. It does, however, maintain diplomatic relations with Moscow."
