fatal crash were Americans. Of the Venezuelan 24 were students in this country, ranging in age from 15 to 20, returning home for a happy summer vacation. Others were French, Italian, Spanish.

The pilot's last words on the radio were: "Roger, we're cleared to drop gas." Roger, we have New York in sight.

Suddenly it wasn't routine anymore. A burst of flame belled out under the aircraft.

Someone in one of the airplanes standing by in the area shouted a warning: "Get your seats about 160—get your speed about 160—you're on fire."

But there was no time. Like a falling star, the plane nosed over and dove almost straight down.

The CAB transcribed all the frantic radio calls in minutes before the doomed plane fell.

This is the worst plane disaster involving a regular airline flight in aviation history.

Strosberg Case Civil Suit Settled

New London, June 21 (AP)—A civil suit settlement yesterday wrote this to a mystery that baffled Connecticut last year when the gouged-out body of Harry Strosberg was found in a lake at the end of a trail of blood over country roads.

Mrs. Annie Sudd of Windham, a business associate of Strosberg's, said later that she noticed after Strosberg's "dial of a heart attack" her East Lyme Cottage, had his body behind her and lowered it to the lake.

Mrs. Strosberg of Waterford, said Mrs. Sudd for \$65,000, saying she suffered much mental anguish as a result. The suit was settled for an undisclosed amount before the case was to come up in Superior Court.
