Examiner Rules Murder, Suicide

Milford, June 27 (AP)—Without waiting for an autopsy report, Medical Examiner William J. H. Fisher said today he was convinced that Robert Butryn, 26-year-old Dutch immigrant, who strangled his wife and shot himself.

The bodies of Butryn and his wife, Jacqueline, also 26, were found in their three-room apartment in the thickly settled Fort Trumbull shore-front section of Milford Tuesday morning.

Her neck badly bruised, Mrs. Butryn was found fully clothed and dead on a bed. Her husband, a 27-year-old Dutch immigrant, was found slumped over a table in a small hallway between the bedroom and a dining room.

Butryn, an automobile mechanic, shot himself in the right temple and the bullet went right through his head, Dr. Fisher said.

Both the medical Examiner and Det. Alfred Moffett, in charge of a Milford Police crew investigating the two deaths, said that Butryn had the pistol clenched so tightly in his fist that no other person could have so positioned it after killing him.

Blood leaking through the floor of the second-floor Butryn apartment attracted attention of the occupant of a first-floor apartment who notified police but requested police to withhold his identity.

Dr. Fisher expressed the opinion that Mr. and Mrs. Butryn had been dead about 18 hours when their bodies were found Tuesday morning.

Police are still investigating the case but as yet have found no neighbors who heard any shots fired. Two bullets were fired, one went into a living room. The other could have been a second shot fired by Butryn after the first one went into his head, police theorized.

Officially, authorities have established no motive for the apparent murder of Mrs. Butryn.

For Present and Future Scientists Show Concern On Effects of Radiation

"recognizable" genetic defects of a mental or physical character due to the increased radiation exposure of their parents. Moreover, an additional 1,000,000 of them would carry in their own "genes" hidden defects which could come to the fore in descendants over a number of later generations.

And remember, such defects in all instances would be over and above approximately similar numbers of defects produced by natural radioactivity.

How much radiation would be "doubling dose"?

Geneticists figure it might be somewhere between 30 and 80 "mrem" — a roentgen being a measuring unit of radioactivity. How many roentgens is the population receiving now in its sex glands?

Whether it will be done that way or (just) in terms of roentgen records (based on doctor's X-ray records or computations by scientists of radiation in the atmosphere, for example), this is a question of practicality.

It is a little something of a nuisance to keep (such a record), but it looks as though we are headed for a kind of future where this is an absolutely necessary piece of information to know about human beings. If so, then we will be ingenious enough to collect it.

Let us have the idea that recognizable genetic damage could show up for centuries, look at this picture as presented in the academy report.

At present, about two per cent of all babies born in the United States have genetic defects caused by natural radioactivity in the environment and possibly other natural causes.

Now, if the sex glands of mankind were subjected to a "doubling dose" of man-made radiation — at an amount sufficient to produce harmful genetic mutations equal in number to those produced spontaneously — this would mean that 100 million babies born to Americans now living, possibly 200,000,000 of them would have

New Lighting Will Brighten Streets in Rockville Center

Rockville, June 27 (Special)—The Downtown Rockville will take on a considerably brighter outlook at night because the summer is over, says Donald E. Weeks, manager of the local office of the Connecticut Light and Power Co.

Weeks made the statement when he was asked the status of a project his company and city officials have been working on to install several large lights in the center of the town.

The lights 20 in. all, each 20,000 lumens strong, have been ordered from Westinghouse Electric Corp., Weeks said. Delivery should be sometime within the next few weeks, and as soon as they arrive the power company is prepared to install them.

The lights of the fluorescent type will run from the Union Congregational Church to the Rockville Leader building on E. and W. Main Sts. and on Park St.

One light will be placed at Union Church, one at the traffic circle, and three along the south side of W. Main St. On E. Main St. four units will be placed on the south side and six on the north side. Because of the width of the street in this area, the lights are placed on both sides, Weeks explained. Five fixtures will be installed on Park St.

New wood poles are being set now for the lights along the area. The city began studying the possibility of installing the fixtures some time ago, asking why power company officials.

Weeks was asked why fluorescent lighting was chosen over the various other types now in use in many areas. He said it is the only lighting in the way of street lighting because it affords more natural-looking light.

Other types in common use are mercury vapor, which gives a blue-green tint, and sodium vapor, which gives a orange-yellow tint. The new fluorescent lights here will be the first of their type to be installed in northeastern Connecticut, power company officials say.

As to cost of the project, Weeks said figures had not been completed. "The city will not pay for the lighting fixtures, but will pay a yearly or monthly rate for their services, much like home owners purchase electric service from the company, the official explained. As yet the rate has not been set, he said.

McGuire Loses Democratic Bid In Wallingford

Wallingford, June 27 (AP)—The "old guard" retained control of the Democratic town committee in a party primary yesterday. Among the losing candidates was former U.S. Rep. John A. McGuire.

Because of the long list of candidates, tabulation of paper ballots was not completed until shortly before 3 a.m. today.

Control of the committee was thrown open to primary by decision of the committee itself. Usually under the state's new law, the controlling faction in the party announces its candidates for the town committee. If any party member opposes candidates, he calls for a primary.

In the Wallingford case, the town committee endorsed no candidates in that manner and called instead for a primary.

"Old Guard" Democrats took 38 seats while the remaining 29 were split up among the West Side Democratic Club which controlled the old committee and members of the Young Democratic Club.

McGuire, who supported Republican Gov. John Lodge's re-election in 1954, ran last in the district. The winner in the district received 101 votes, McGuire got 47. He ran as an independent town candidate.

Of the 24,000 Democrats eligible to cast ballots in the primary, only 1,254 turned out.

Work Progressing on Nike Sites in Area

Work is progressing rapidly at the Manchester Nike control center and the Glastonbury launching site, with only interior work remaining on all but one building at the local site, which is at Keeney St. south of the Garden Grove.

The Wesler Construction Co. which was contracted to build both the Manchester and Glastonbury sites, has nearly completed five buildings at the local site. At the Glastonbury launching area, three units are nearing completion and completely cleared of trees.

The building on the highest level at the local site, which will house radar and other Nike equipment, overlooks Manchester, Hartford and other distant areas.

An artesian well is being drilled at the local site to provide water for Nike personnel stationed here.

Maximum safety precautions will be taken when Army Nike personnel take over the area. Explosives and fuel will be stored underground, and air fighting equipment and personnel trained to use it will be available. There will be no test or training firing of the missiles.

The engineers plan to ask bids on construction of several groups of single unit dwellings of two and three bedroom design.

The contracts will be awarded for whole defense areas. In the Hartford defense area, which includes the launching site in Glastonbury and the control site in Manchester, 128 units will be built. Thirty-two of those units will be built in Glastonbury. The Army reportedly wants to acquire property owned by Mrs. Mary T. Richmond, 608 B. Main St. That property, on the east side of Manchester Rd., is about 16 acres, which begins about 700 to 800 feet south of the local site.

Neighbors have objected to construction of the units there.

Rep. Mahon Will Study Air Force Funds Hike

Washington, June 27 (AP)—Rep. Mahon (D-Tex.) today said he will study the House bill to increase the Air Force budget by \$1 billion, mostly for procurement of jet bombers.

The Senate, on a 48-40 vote, decided yesterday that President Eisenhower had not budgeted enough money to build up U. S. airpower in the race with Russia. It approved an extra \$1,343,000,000 for the coming 12 months. There was disagreement as to whether it would be spent, or could be spent wisely.

The \$33 billion armed forces money bill then was passed on an 85-70 roll call, sending it to conference with the House, which earlier voted about \$33 billion.

House Appropriations Unit, Mahon, as chairman of an appropriations subcommittee which handled the measure, will hear House conferees who will meet with representatives of the Senate to hammer out a compromise. He said in an interview he is "very sympathetic to increased airpower" and added: "But I want to talk with the Defense people first. I want to find out if they need and will use the additional funds."

Sen. Symington (D-Mo.) concurred during debate that the added funds may not be spent by Eisenhower and Secretary of Defense Wilson. Wilson has said the extra billion isn't needed but that if Congress finally approves it, he will take another look.

Eisenhower budgeted \$33 billion for the Air Force in the Defense establishment. Of that, \$10 billion more than \$15 billion was earmarked for the Air Force, over \$10 billion for the Navy and Marine, and \$7 billion for the Army.

The House cut this total back to about \$33 billion, voting almost \$10 billion for the Air Force.

Senate actions yesterday boosted these totals to just under \$33 billion in all, including more than \$16 billion for the Air Force.

Army gets \$48 billion more. There was no dispute about Army and Navy funds. The Senate added \$48 million to the Army.

Bubonic Plague Kills In California

San Francisco, June 27 (AP)—Bubonic plague was confirmed yesterday as the cause of the death of Andrew Sakaka, 43, of Fort Huachuca, Calif., who died last night at Corona Naval Hospital.

The announcement was made by Dr. Malcolm H. Merrill, head of the State Department of Health, at Berkeley.

It was the first reported human case of the plague in California since 1947.

The announcement said Sakaka may have been infected when he went to the Sespe Gorge in Ventura County on a fishing trip June 16. He was hospitalized June 27.

Various forms of rodents carry the plague infection, which is transmitted by fleas from the blood-sucking animal to another.

Dr. Merrill said plague-infected fleas rarely bite humans.

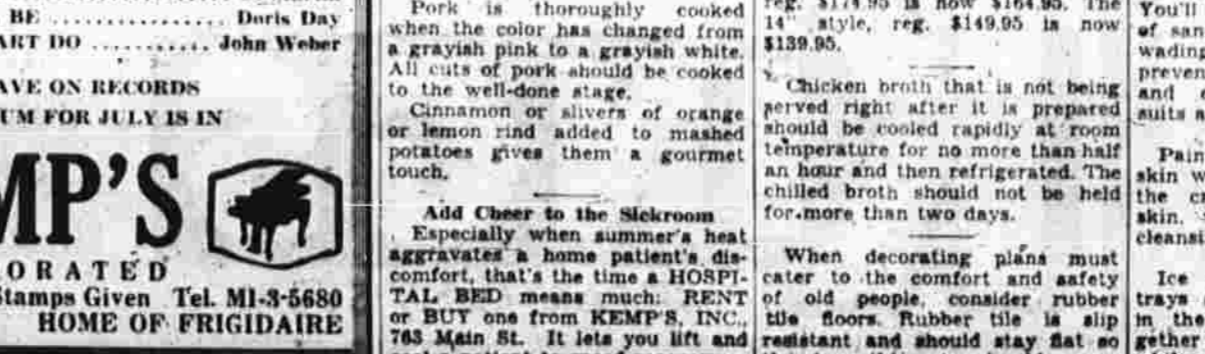
