for the combined efforts of weathermen, oceanographers, agricultural scientists and experts in the disposal of radioactive wastes, the academy said.

The academy, which has been advising the government on tough scientific problems ever since Abraham Lincoln's time, set forth these conclusions in its recent report on hazards inherent in radiation of any kind.

It listed radiation from atomic bomb tests, nuclear power plants, medical X-rays, and from naturally radioactive materials in the ground and atmosphere.

Elsewhere in its report, the academy said there is a need for greater technical improvements to assure against serious and conceivably even catastrophic - accidental releases of radioactivity from atomic reactors. Academy scientists say, however, that present reactor safeguards against these and lesser dangers have had a very fine record, although they add that the protective measures still could stand improvement.

Concerning radiation once released - whether from reactors, reactor waste or "leakage" from bomb tests - the academy said:

Between the potential sources of man-made radiation and the people of the world there is a complex "connecting network" of air, water, and the plant and animal life which form the links in the chain of our food supply.

The scientists added:

"It is a long way from Eniwetok to Chicago or Bombay. A power station in Ohio or Moscow is a far remove (sic) from Johannesburg. Yet all these places are in the same ocean of air; all are surrounded by the interwoven web of life which eventually appears in another region where human activities might be endangered."

Rockville School Board Budget Airing Set for July

Rockville, June 28 (Special) - A budget for 1956-57 will be the topic of a July 18 meeting of the Vernon Board of Education, Chairman Morgan I. Campbell said today.

The chairman said while the board has not definitely decided whether to hold a public hearing on the budget, he personally saw no reason for not holding it. He said he would contact members before the meeting.

At the time it was decided to hold the budget meeting, members of the board expressed the opinion that some of the controversy which resulted during the current year might have been avoided if the public had had an opportunity to understand the situation.

All meetings of the board except executive sessions are open to the public. However, relatively few townpeople have attended other than on a few occasions where special invitations were extended.

A subcommittee has been working on the budget for several weeks, and is expected to complete the figures by the time the July meeting date arrives, so action may be taken by the board.

Once approved, the budget goes to the Board of Finance for consideration at its budget hearing in August.

Usually the budget is completed earlier, but this year there have been various matters to be decided upon before final figures could be set.
