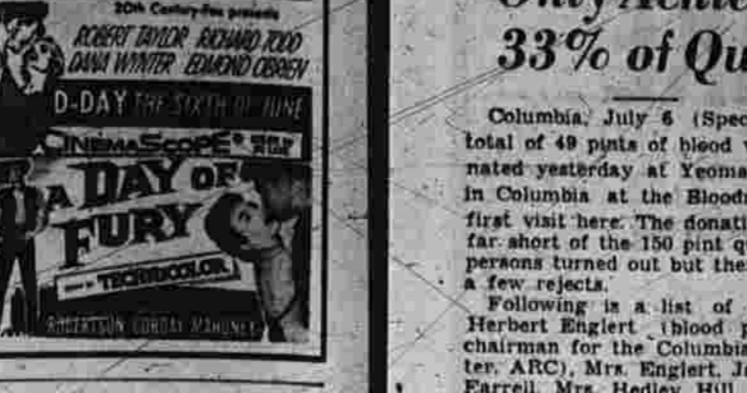

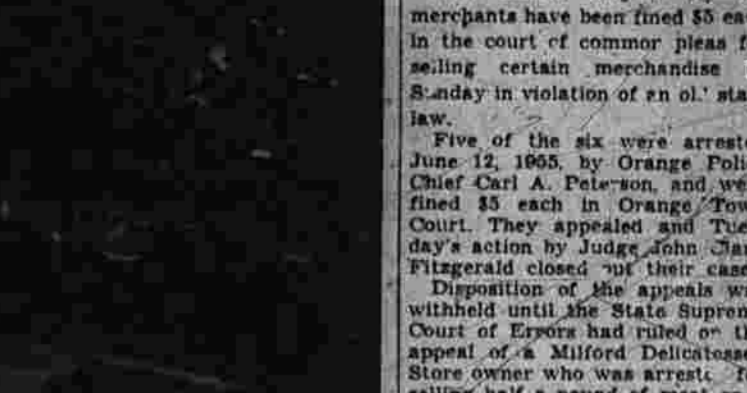

Tax Collections In June \$93,500

Tax Collector Paul Cervini reports that \$93,500 in property taxes were collected during the month of June, bringing to \$373,321.18 the amount collected thus far this fiscal year.

The unpaid balance on current (1955) taxes is \$1,098,064.42 but the second payment was due July 1, the day after the effective date of Cervini's report.

Cervini today reminded owners of real and personal property that Aug. 1 is the deadline for payment of the tax. Interest is charged when payment is made after that date.

The report shows the unpaid balance on all past taxes is \$20,403.46. The latest back list on which taxes are still owed is \$500. Payments have been made during this year on liens dating to 1947.

Revenues from all sources other than property taxes during June amounted to \$32,061.87, bringing the total for this fiscal year to \$277,543.05.

The report shows that the town collected \$2,677.39 in June from parking meters along town streets and \$977.74 from the town-owned parking lot, collecting to this year from the meters was \$22,264.69 and from the lot, \$1,147.80.

A parking committee from the Board of Directors is currently studying methods to increase street parking spaces in the area between State College, Oak and Main Sts. and to make the parking lot more easily accessible. Presumably the parking meter fund will be used to finance part of whatever improvements are made there.

University Plans Carillon Concerts

The first of a proposed series of carillon concerts during the summer will be held at the Community Church at 8:30 p.m. Tuesday evening, July 18, from 7 to 8 with Martin C. Corbett of Darien as carillonneur.

The recital is under sponsorship of the University of Connecticut Music Department, and programs will be distributed to visitors at the north entrance to the University campus in front of the Community Church, in whose tower the Danham Memorial Carillon is located.

The Music Department recommends that listeners bring blankets or lawn chairs so that they may hear the recital from the shores of Swan Lake. A short distance from the Carillon Tower, Corbett is carillonneur at St. James Episcopal Church, Danbury, and vice president of the Guild of Carillonneurs of North America.

WCH License Shifted

Washington July 6 (AP)—The Federal Communications Commission yesterday approved the argument of licensees of station WCHT, Hartford, Conn., to take Broadcasters of Connecticut, Inc. for \$240,000.

The license has been held by General Times Television Corp. The commission also granted station WCHT in New Haven, Conn., a change in daytime power from 1,000 to 8,000 watts and made WCHS of Bristol, Conn., a party to a hearing on an application for a new 500-watt standard radio station to operate daytime only on 1440 kilocycles, made by Babylon-Bay Shore Broadcasting Co., Babylon, N.Y.
