- A FATHER'S STORY -PARENT WOULD GIVE OWN LIFE TO BRING BACK DEAD YOUTH

(EDITOR'S NOTE: One week ago tonight an automobile driven by the 16-year-old son of City Rep. Bill Myers went out of control at high speed on Bayshore Boulevard, resulting in death for one Plant High student and injury to five others in the car. The Times requested Representative Myers to write the following in the interest of public safety. The article is written both from a standpoint of a public official and a father.) By W. B. (BILL) MYERS City Representative

I was attending the Latin-American Fiesta when I was notified When I arrived at the hospital I went straight to the operating room. My boy Tommy was lying on a stretcher. His leg was all bent over to one side, his mouth was split open, a big gash was on his right leg, his right ankle was badly swollen. Tommy's eyes were open but he didn't recognize anyone.

He screamed out several times with pain when they put him

on the operating table. Every scream he made hurt me and his mother as much as it did him. I knew they were doing everything possible but I just couldn't help feeling that way.

Then I saw the Korbly boy. (Mike Korbly, 17, who later died.) I heard a gurgling sound coming from his threat. I knew then that both he and my son were terribly hurt. I talked to Young Korbly's mether and father. They were so broken up but still they comforted me and my wife and we tried to do the same.
It was a wholesale tragedy.

And we realized that Tommy must face the fact that the boy lost his life in the car Tommy has driving.

I am terribly sorry it happened. It is the families who suffer more than anyone else because they must go on after their loved

There is nothing in the world to compensate for the loss of a life. If I could give my own life for that boy's, I surely would. I feel that with all my heart.

Whatever charge they place against Tommy, he is going to have to take it. He was wrong. I'll stand by him as a father, but not as a public official. but not as a public official.

If every parent of a leenager who drives could stand by help-

on an operating table, wondering if they will live or die, I'm suse they would wish that the automobile had never been invented.

Yet, you realize you are helpless because you can't lock your children in the house and tell them they can't be a part of society. And you can't be with them every minute:

Tommy, like a lot of other youngsters, loves motors and machinery. When most teenagers were reading comic books, he was reading Popular Mechanics. He can strip and assemble almost any small motor and he loves it. So, naturally, it's hard to keep him away from motors and cars.

Solution, Possible

So what is the answer? If each parent and each teenager realized that death may be lurking around the corner any time.

The Above abusiness of a normal boy and looking around I see many more grownups involved in wrecks than I do teenagers.

The law gives a child 16 years old the right to drive. But I feel that each parent should examine his own child as an individual and determine whether the child is fit from the stand-point of maturity and common sense, to operate a lethal weapon such as the modern car.

Only then, can the decision be made.

And when it is made, parents and child alike should stop and think and put themselves in that hospital operating room and see themselves as I saw my young son and his friends.

Then, perhaps the polat will be driven home with all the impact it deserves.

I know that much of the problem is centered around speed. Ever since we have had a television set in our home, all I can remember seeing on automobile ads is power, speed, rommy, in many cases, has brought to me information as to what different cars can do in the way of pickup from a standstill, how fast they can go in 10 seconds 60, 70 miles an hour.

They show speed races, advertise that their car is the pacecar at Indianapolis Speedway. You hear more about speed than

you do about safety.
