Town, CD to Take Part In 'Operation Alert'

Manchester residents will join with others in Connecticut on July 20, participating for 15 minutes in part of "Operation Alert," a nationwide Civil Defense exercise. Except for the brief public participation, "Operation Alert" will be largely a "paper exercise" in Connecticut designed primarily to test Connecticut and to determine how effectively CD can be mobilized in the event of a bomb attack.

Police will sound the "Red Alert" and stop traffic at exactly 4:10 p.m. July 20, and traffic will remain halted until 4:25 p.m. Occupants of vehicles are asked to take cover in the nearest shelter or remain in cars, with windows open.

Broadcasts to Cease All regular radio broadcasts will go off the air at 4:10 and radio should be turned to 640 or 1240, the Concord frequencies. The Concord system stations will broadcast instructions about the exercise.

Wardens and auxiliary police will assist regular police in halting traffic and ushering persons to shelter. The exercise will take place over a 48-hour period, from 11 a.m. July 20 to 11 p.m. July 21.

Theoretically, 76 targets throughout the country will be attacked. One of them is Hartford and it is being assumed that minor damage is done in an area 3.4 miles around the point where the bomb hits.

For five of the divisions in the local Civil Defense organization, participation in the exercise means reporting at 6 p.m. July 20 at the personnel and equipment available for emergency use.

Departments Report The fire department will report on the number of pieces of equipment and the number of auxiliary firemen. Reports will also be made on the number of doctors and dentists, the amount of construction equipment, emergency housing, and transportation which could be called into immediate use.

The geological division will determine the danger from radioactive fallout and make its report. At CD headquarters in the basement of the Municipal Building, the Communications Division will be on duty for 36 hours, and plans call for having the Skywatch post manned completely for a 36-hour period as expected.

Charges against Dr. Joseph Zampieri of Winthrop were dropped and the case against another doctor is pending.

The State Board of Registration in Medicine acted after Supreme Court Justice John V. Spalding said the doctors' split fees were not case fees with former District Court Judge Anthony A. Centracchio, who has been disbarred.

Griffith to Oppose Watson For District Senate Seat

State Rep. John Griffith of East Hartford, Democrat, announced today that he will oppose the nomination of State Senator last night after the last-minute candidacy of a Newington man forced a convention.

Joseph Coonrod, a former Newington Town Court judge, had surprised the convention delegates at the Hookanum School in East Hartford with his announcement that he was going to seek the nomination.

But Griffith, the pre-convention choice, overruled him in the halling, getting the vote of every delegate present except those from Newington. The final tally was 38 to 5.

At the conclusion of the roll-call vote, the Newington delegation asked to be polled again, and all five voted for Griffith, making him the unanimous choice.

Newington asked permission to vote again after they learned that, under the new State primary law, a record of the vote would have to be submitted to the Secretary of State's office. A Newington delegate said his delegation did not want to be listed as "mavericks."

Griffith, who has served in the State House of Representatives for three terms, will oppose State Sen. Elmer S. Watson of Wethersfield, whom Fourth District Republicans have nominated for a fourth term.

Griffith Confident

In running for the State Senate, Griffith is giving up what he described in his acceptance speech last night as "a nice comfortable seat in the House." East Hartford has a solid Democratic majority, which almost assures local Democratic candidates of election.

But he expressed confidence that he could win in the Fourth District, despite the fact that 12 right towns constitute a strong Republican section of the State. Besides East Hartford, Newington and Wethersfield, the district includes Manchester, Marlborough, Tarry Hill, Glastonbury and South Windsor.

In nominating Coonrod, the Newington delegation was seeking to break what it considers the monopoly that East Hartford and Manchester, the district's two largest towns, hold on important district nominations.

Atty. John D. LaBelle, Manchester's Democratic town chairman, was the district's nominee for the State senate in 1952 and again in 1954, but lost both times to Watson.

William P. Appell, who placed Coonrod's name in nomination, said candidates from these towns had lost in the past and now, he added, "we're being asked to nominate another candidate from East Hartford."

He argued that Newington, a rapidly growing town with 1,700 new voters, occupied a strategic position. He said Newington could go either to the Republicans or Democrats and that a candidate from that town could tip the balance.

"East Hartford," he said, "is the best Democratic town in the district, and will remain the best whom you nominate."

East Hartford Town Chairman James Flanagan, who placed Griffith's name in nomination, said his townman was a candidate who could campaign through the "highways and byways" of the district and "make the lanes known."

Harry J. O'Brien of South Windsor was the convention chairman, and Miss Jean Paquin of Manchester was its secretary.

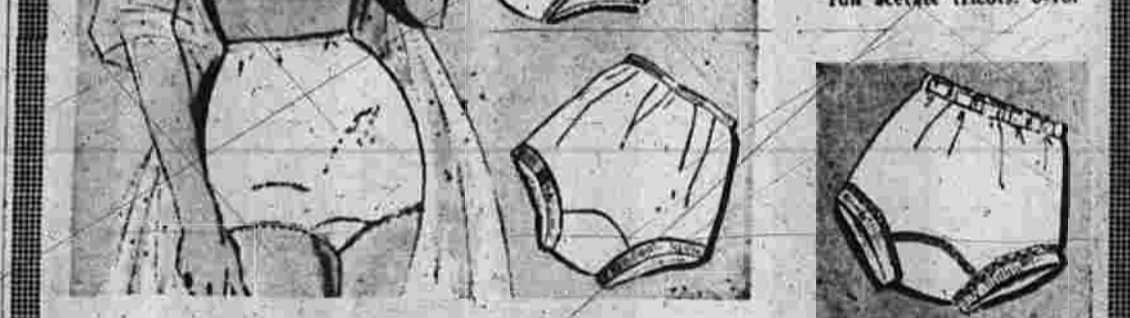

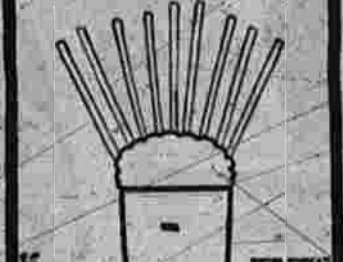
