Man's Suicide

Man's Suicide Attempt Fatal to 6-Week-Old Girl New York, July 19 (AP) - A powerful gas explosion, touched off by what authorities described as a suicide attempt, took the life of a 6-week-old girl and injured five persons yesterday. On Tuesday, William Kulkas, 40, a mechanic, was booked on a manslaughter charge. Authorities said investigation of his apartment showed that four gas jets on the kitchen range had been open. Kulkas was described by neighbors as being distraught as a result of his wife's death of cancer last April. He was reported in critical condition at a hospital. The blast reduced the 2-story house to a heap of rubble. Two adjacent houses were badly damaged. The infant, Margaret Kay DeGregorio, died about three hours after the explosion. Her mother, Florence, 28, was in poor condition at a hospital but is being treated for the shock of the building. Ironically, police said Mrs. DeGregorio was telephoning her policeman-brother to tell him that she was all right.

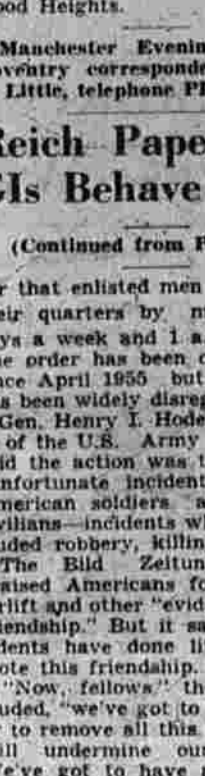
