If that is good news, if we are going to put the welfare and happiness of the Polish people first, the mildness of Ochab is not the only interesting development within the ranks of the Polish Communist leadership. Another sign of the times would seem to be the increasing boldness of Professor Oskar Lange, the economic expert, whose acceptance of the Communism in Poland has been a narrow to many, especially since he has had experience with American-style democracy in the post-Polan discussions. Lange has been making speeches which sound as if his goal for Poland is not democracy after all, rather than Communism. The other day, for instance, he blamed Poland's economic ills on bureaucratism, excessive centralization, and lack of democratic controls in party, trade unions, and government.
