#### The Impossible Happened

As it was with the Titanic so many decades ago, it was impossible for it to happen.

Both ships were equipped with radar, which made collision impossible.

And the Andrea Doria was unshakable in construction, even if a collision did occur.

But the collision occurred, and the Andrea Doria did sink.

Fortunately, when the impossible did happen, a lot of other things were possible. The sea happened to be calm. One of the things that produced the collision was that the area south of Nantucket is a sort of crossroads for shipping, so there were rescue ships near. The calmness of the sea made rescue operations possible in a swift, safe, and orderly manner. By the time the Andrea Doria had come for the death of the Andrea Doria, some 12 hours after the collision, every live member of the passenger list had been removed. This was all supreme good fortune. Had the seas themselves been difficult, the story could have been vastly different.

Now there will be study and investigation, to find out what went wrong. And, for the future, we will devise new safeguards to make such collisions impossible, and new miracles in ship construction, to make ships unshakable even if collisions occur.

Then we will be off again, secure and serene in our accomplishment until there is again a crisis time, another failure in equipment or in human beings. The quest for perfection, one surmises, is never to be won. There can be gratitude that this present lapse, at once a failure and a stimulus in the struggle, has been mercifully low in its human cost.

#### Equal Treatment, Please

At the meeting of New Haven Railroad stockholders at which his own salary was boosted modestly from \$300,000 to \$350,000 a year, plus a vote for payment of \$20,000 a year to him for 12 years if he should resign or retire after his present five year contract, President George Albert brought up the issue of the railroad's branch lines, and intimated that almost all of them are too expensive for the railroad to maintain. They are, he said, the source of all the New Haven's losses.

Accordingly, the railroad is going to make a survey of each of the 39 branch lines, to see which ones should be discarded. Meanwhile, the railroad is already petitioning the Connecticut Public Utilities Commission for permission to drop passenger service on its Waterbury to Winsted line.

The railroad's petition to drop service on the Hartford-Manchester-Willimantic-Putnam-Boston line is already in.

There is a slight difference between the petition to abandon the Eastern Connecticut branch line and the railroad's attitude toward its other 39 branch lines.

Our line is closed down in advance of any approval of its abandonment by the P.U.C. The railroad, in effect, has closed it first, and asked permission to do so second. It has done this, of course, only because there happened to be a flood in Putnam last summer.

That closed the line. All the railroad has to do to keep it closed is exactly what it has been doing, which is to refuse to repair the bridge at Putnam. In our case, it is not, then, merely a question of giving the railroad permission to abandon the line. It is more properly a question of our having to try to force the railroad to open it up again. And our point of view is that, whether or not there was a flood, we ought to have just as much chance fighting for our line as any other company or

#### group of communities has in fighting for its line.

It may well be, as President Albert said at the New Haven meeting, that most branch lines "are outdated and obsolete and are no longer required and have followed the stage coach and covered wagons into oblivion."

We happen to suspect, however, that as the national highway madness gets worse, these branch lines might prove not so obsolete and unprofitable after all. We are sure that some people in the years ahead, will have an increased taste for safety, convenience, and relaxed traveling.

#### Resignation Accepted

Surely, in these times of ideological turbulence, there has been no stranger story than that of Harry P. Carr, a Republican senator from Washington, until the Eisenhower tide in 1952 failed to carry him to reelection, he was one to be classified with Sen. McCarthy. And when President Eisenhower named him to the Subversive Activities Control Board, the appointment was certainly a gesture to the Republican right wing and certainly proof that the Eisenhower administration was going to be tough on security issues.

Then, after a year or so on the board, there came a sudden transformation. The one-time crusader for ideological toughness suddenly became passionately concerned with the injustices he found done to innocent men in the name of ideological security. He began to be concerned with proving the innocence of those men. His concern began to be convinced that the security system was savage and ruthless, and capable of frequent injury to innocent men. He crusaded for individuals, and he crusaded for changes in the whole system.

His new crusading became almost as extreme as his old crusading alongside McCarthy had been. Sherman Adams accused him of being a divisive force on the "Eisenhower team."

He wanted to see the President, and couldn't, and he charged that the President was being fed misinformation about the security program. Finally, just recently, he did get in to see the President, and was inspired by the way Eisenhower received him and listened to him. But he had some time ago read the handwriting on the wall, and concluded that he had already lost all chance of reappointment, and he has now submitted his resignation, and it has been accepted by Eisenhower. He is out for having advocated too strenuously a point of view opposite to that he held when originally appointed, for having gone to the headlines too loudly with views which should not be in the hands of the general public, and for his own personal views of the White House itself.

As he goes, he has this comfort to take with him. He proved, we think, that he was right when he crusaded for the innocence of the individual cases he crusaded for. And he played a part in the timely and much-needed reversal of this nation's tendency to become a police state, dominated by accusation and suspicion.

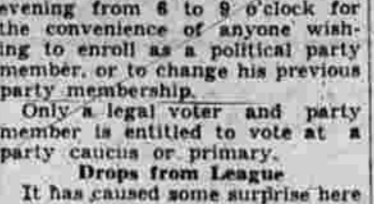
