Urquhart Offers \$1,000 Rent For Use of County Building

Senators has refused to confirm the appointment of former Superior Court Judge John O. Brien to be a member of the board of governors of Rutgers University.

The reason is that Judge Brien once represented a client who took the Fifth Amendment.

Even had Judge Brien represented the client voluntarily, that would still have been nothing against him. Taking the Fifth Amendment is not a crime. It is only in the Constitution to be taken.

But Judge Brien took this client not of his own volition, but at the request of the Essex County Bar Association.

That makes his situation similar to that of the Connecticut lawyers who recently represented the defendants in the Smith Act trial down in New Haven. Their legal lawyers, precisely to make sure that they suffered no future stigma for their role, to which they defied alleged Communists to the best of their legal and moral ability, publicly contributed to a fund to recompense them for their services, not to the alleged Communists, but to their own and the most respected lawyers in the country.

The New Jersey legislature has to have one of these Connecticut lawyers in a similar position proposed for some public position and voted by the Legislature because he or she had once "represented a Communist."

Now that this has happened in New Jersey, the Bar Association which requested Judge Brien to represent its members, and which gave its services, along with other leadership in the state, is trying to move for a rescue and a full exoneration, and the outcome is in doubt. If only those who profess to be defending Americanism would first develop some slight comprehension of what Americanism really is.

We prefer "The Old" Adlai Stevenson, Senator Kefauver not only admits his defeat in the primary war with Stevenson, but has an explanation of it. Stevenson, he says, has put much more personality and drive into his campaigning since the Minnesota primary, where Kefauver was defeated. Stevenson is a much better campaigner than the old Stevenson. Kefauver now thinks he has a "good chance" of winning next fall's election.

Both hope and believe that at least the first part of Kefauver's appraisal is not true. The only difference in Stevenson and Kefauver is in Stevenson's ability to talk personalities and throw campaign mud. We doubt that this helped him in the election. Kefauver's campaign was in our favor. In fact, we think he has defeated Kefauver, not because Kefauver was a better campaigner, but because he has remained himself and refrained from giving his halfhearted, incongruous imitation of Kefauver's own style. Kefauver was, in our opinion, the fact that voters began to take his primariness seriously, and that they then stopped voting for him primarily as a lack.

As for the "new Stevenson" now having a better chance of defeat than President Eisenhower, we think that Stevenson has been building himself up by least doing more by throwing mud rather than principles by deserting moderation for the gain coming out of it.

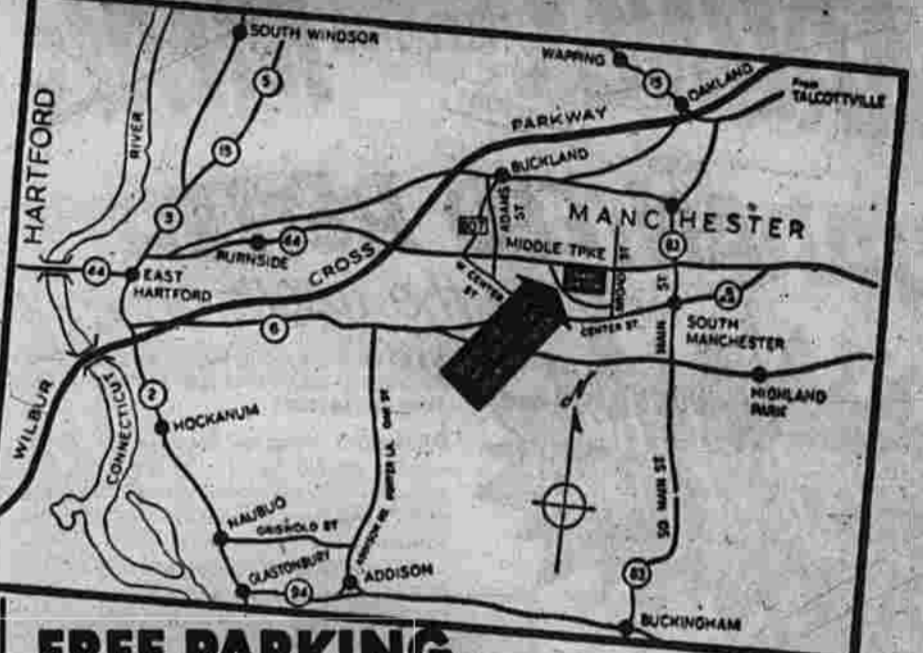

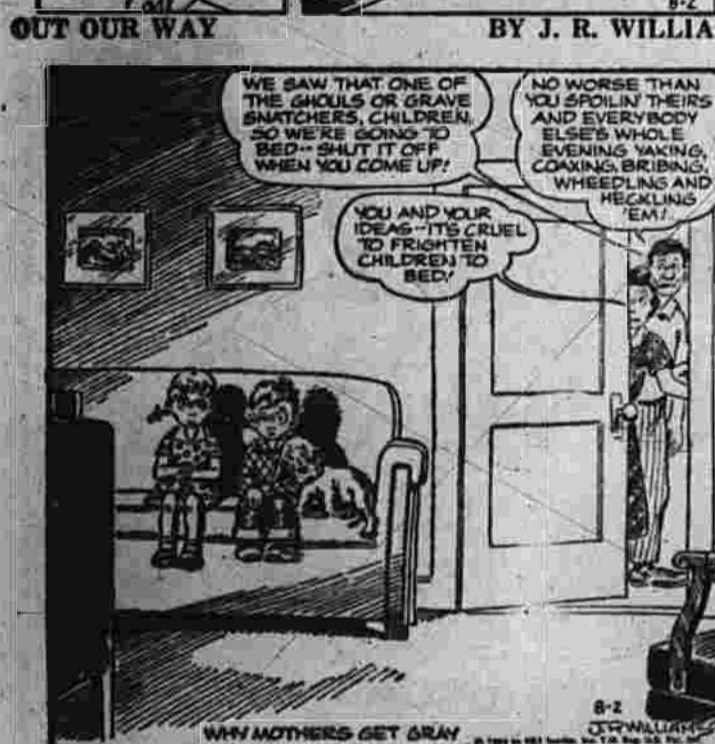

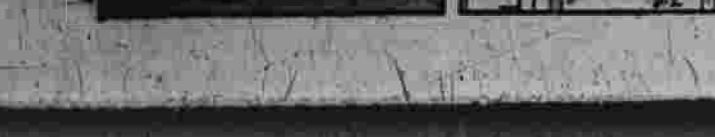
