The Rockville-Vernon Report: School Costs, Growing City-Town Rifts Cited

Rockville, Aug. 3 (Special)—Addition of five mills later when steadily mounting education costs and school enrollments, coupled with a growing rift between city and town, were cited as major reasons for advancement of two school districts by a 30-man study committee organized by Mayor Herman G. Olson two months ago.

As serious as it now is, this rift immediately ahead unless one or the other is carefully considered and a practical and fair course of action is plotted, says the report.

The committee states unanimous opinion that the only solution to the dilemma is creation of two separate school districts, one embracing the city of Rockville, the other including rural Vernon.

To support this proposed separate school district, the report says it would be necessary to levy a tax of approximately 38 mills (including cost of a new high school) on rural Vernon and a tax of about 45 mills (including cost of a new filtration plant) on Rockville.

Without the two school districts, the committee estimates the tax rate for Rockville at 45.5 mills, including a levy for the proposed filtration plant, with the
