

15 Deaths Caused

Chairman Otto A. Wiesley of Utah's state industrial commission, said a workman who helped change the restaurant over to natural gas Sunday testified he abut off the main valve on top of a propane gas lank. Another witness said he shut off the same valve when he

found it open after the blast had laveled the cafe.

What nobody apparently knew.
Wiesley said, was that the line from. whealey said, was that the line from the propane tank branched and served a nearby apartment house as well as the cafe.

"Someone from the apartment house may—I'm not saying they did, but they may—have gone over and opened the valve." Wiesley He said leaking gas apparently filled the cellar of the restaurant and the open flame in an oven touched it off.
